and latter same Lat 26° 30' N
Long 23° 28' W

Friday 31 Aug

First part fresh breeze
from E by N Shps course S.W.
Middle and latter fresh breeze
from E.N.E. saw one Merchant Ship

Saturday 1 Sept

First part fresh breeze
from E.N.E. Middle and latter same
Lat 21° 54' N
Long 23° 00' W

Sunday 2 Sept 1833

First part fresh breeze
E.N.E. Middle and latter same
Lat 19° 45' N
Long 24° 00' W

Monday Sept 3rd

All these 24 hours strong
N.E. Breeze at 11 A.M. spoke Bark
Oufellow. Near MacHarbor No obs

Tuesday 4th Sept

First part commences
strong N.E. Breeze at 1 P.M. saw
the Pelane Sh. Antone at 3 the wind
all died away to a calm at 9 P.M.
strong winds from N.W. Ship heading
on harbour back latter moderate
breeze from S.W. to S.N. lowered
Boats for Blackfish struck one
and cut the line with some small
sails in sight and also Sh. Antone

Lat 17° 25' N
Long 25° 50' W

Wednesday 5 Sept

First part light wind
from S.W. Middle Calm latter light
air from the N.W. Sh. Antone
in sight Dist 30 miles also several
ships in sight Lat 17° 05' N

Thursday 6 Sept

First part light breeze
from N.W. Middle and latter
fresh breeze from N.W. to East
saw several sail Lat 14° 50' N
Long 26° 02' W
