light winds from the Westward  
with thick weather

Tuesday 21 Nov  
All these 24 hours fresh  
winds from the N Westward  
saw many Finbacks  
Lat 33° 07' N  
Long 7° 14' E

Wednesday 22 Nov  
First part strong  
breezes from the N.W. Middle  
and latter light winds from the  
Westward saw Finbacks  
Lat 35° 37' N  
Long 5° 47' E

Thursday 23 Nov  
First part light breezes  
from the Westward at 3 P.M. lowered  
for two Humpbacks at 4 P.M. lower  
ed for sperm Whales at 5 P.M.  
at sunset got fast at 8 got the whale  
to the ship. light winds through the  
night latter about calm at 11 got  
the head off and blubber in - Robbs

Friday

Friday 30 Nov  
First part about calm  
at 2 P.M. got the head all in and  
commenced boiling. Middle and  
latter very light airs and calm  
saw several Ant for bottoms  
Lat 35° 32' N  
Long 5° 50' E

Saturday 1 Dec 1833  
First part very light airs  
and calm. Middle gentle breezes from  
from the N. and S.E. latter brisk breezes  
from the N.E. at 10 - 40 lb. finished boiling  
Lat 35° 41' N  
Long 5° 35' E

Sunday 2 Dec  
First part fresh breezes from  
N. N.E. with light showers. Middle saw  
latter strong breezes from N.W.  
Lat 35° 37' N  
Long 5° 37' E

Monday 3 Dec  
First part strong breezes from  
N.W. Middle fresh breezes from N.W. and  
S.W. by South employed stowing down  
oil  
Lat 35° 34' N  
Long 5° 30' E

Tuesday 4 Dec  
First part light airs from N.W.  
and calm finished stowing down  
Middle moderate latter fresh breezes  
from the Westward  
Lat 34° 57' N  
Long 5° 52' E

Wednesday 5 Dec  
First part strong breezes  
from N.W. Middle and latter same. saw  
a large English ship pass to the Eastward  
Lat 35° 25' N  
Long 7° 07' E

Thursday 6 Dec  
First part fresh Gales from South  
Middle same latter a little more me  
- ure  
Lat 35° 41' N  
Long 5° 34' E

Saw 2 Humpbacks  
at 3 P.M. 35° 14' N
