

Wednesday 20 Feb 1857

First part light breeze
Spoke English Ship *Hyburnia* 80
days from Shanghai for London
Middle and latter light breeze
Lat 18° 51' N
Long 64° 18' W

Wednesday 27 Feb

First part very light
breeze at 2 P.M. saw St Helena
bearing N 4 W - Middle and latter
light breeze at 10 A.M. St Helena
bearing N E by E dist 40 miles
saw sperm whales to windward
thus ends working the ship to
windward

Thursday 28 Feb

First part light breeze
at past 12 lowered for the whales
and got one at 4 P.M.
took him to the ship put up Tacks
and hooked on. got in the jaw
and head most off at dark
Middle and latter fresh breeze
at daylight commenced cutting
at 11 finished

Friday March 1st

First part fresh breeze
all hands employed clearing away
the case cutting blubber and boiling
Middle and latter fresh breeze
at 7 A.M. spoke Ship *Canton*
Lapham - New Bedford 80 Bbls
at 10 saw the *Canton* whaling
at 11 lowered our Boats this
ends Boats Chasing to leeward

Saturday 2 March 1857

First part fresh breeze
at 2 P.M. Boats came on board
Middle and latter fresh breeze
at 10 A.M. finished boiling saw a
Steamer heading to the South
Lat 18° 54' N
Long 64° 30' W

Sunday 3 March

First part moderate
breeze - Middle and latter strong
breeze St Helena ahead, could not
weather it and steered across on
the lee side

Monday 4 March

First part strong
breeze beating up for the Harbor
Middle and latter same at 11 A.M.
came to anchor at
St Helena
and shipped 110 Bbls sperm oil

Thursday 14 March

At 10 A.M. weighed
anchor and steered to the West
and N.W.

Friday 15 March

First part very strong
breeze Middle and latter same
Ship by the wind to the South

Saturday 16 March

Lat 18° 51' N Long 64° 18' W
First part strong breeze
and rugga Middle same latter
more moderate saw nothing
Lat 17° 11' N
