Sunday 14 July First part fresh breeze
from S W - Middle same latter
light winds Lat 7-59 N
Long 8-23 E.

Monday 15 July First part moderate
breeze from the South - Middle
and latter same Lat 8-04 N
Long 8-48 E.

Tuesday 16 July First part light breezes
from the South - Middle and
latter light airs and Calms

Wednesday 17 July First part light airs
from the South - Middle and
latter much the same
Lat 7-56 N
Long 8-40 E.

Thursday 18 July 1857 First part fresh breezes
from the South - Middle and latter same
Lat 7-48 N
Long 9-44 E.

Friday 19 July First part fresh breezes from
the South - Middle same latter light
airs Lat 7-52 N
Long 10-50 E.

Saturday 20 July First part light airs
from the South saw Humpbacks
and Dolphins - Middle and latter very
light airs S W Lat 7-54 N
Long 11-25 E.

Sunday 21 July First part light airs from
S W - Middle and latter same
Lat 7-33 N
Long 12-18 E.

Monday 22 July First part light breezes from
the South and Calms at 1 P.M. saw the
Land at 8 P.M. Sounda. 30 fathoms water
at 9 wore Ship of Shore Middle mostly
Calm at 4 A.M. headed in Shore
latter light airs from S.W. and thick
weather at 9 saw the Land thus E. was
heaving in for the Land abt 10 of June

Tuesday 23 July First part very light airs and
Calm at 6 let go the anchor at 10 fathoms
water at daylight took the anchor and
steamed. To the North saw one Orca
