Fore Mast Middle and latter light
Trades from the Eastward and Calms

the East Middle mostly Calms latter
gentle breeze from S.E. to S.E.

First part brisk breeze from

and bent same at 5 P.M. saw Blackbird
and towers without success they going
back to windward Middle and latter
strong breeze from S.E. to S.E.
