Friday 15-Nov

First part light winds from
S.E. by E. and E.S.E. Middle and latter light
airs from the Eastward

Lat 36-09 S
Long 5-20 E.

Saturday 16-Nov 1867

First part light airs
from E to S.E. and calms Middle same
latter gentle breezes from the North
Lat 36-19 S
Long 6-08 E.

Sunday 17-Nov

First part light breezes from
the North Middle fresh breezes from
S.W. to W. and squally latter fresh from
S.W. to South saw several Finbacks

Lat 35-27 S.
Long 6-24 E.

Monday 18-Nov

First part fresh breezes
saw land from S. to S.W. Middle and latter
R. Whal much the same saw two sails
going quick to windward
longer and chase

Long 6-18 E.

Tuesday 19-Nov

First part fresh breezes
from South and S.E. at 3 P.M. spoke
Bark Robert Boats of Halifax bound
to Bay of Bengal Middle and latter
fresh breezes from S.E. saw Finbacks
and one Brig

Wednesday 20-Nov

First part moderate breezes
from S.E. to S.E. Middle and latter
light breezes from S.E. to S.E. Lat 35-45
Long 5-50

Thursday 21-Nov

First part light breezes from
E. Middle and latter much the same
Lat 36-44 S
Long 5-12 E.
