

Sunday 1 Decr 1867

First part strong breeze from the Westward - Middle and latter moderate breezes from from the Westward saw Finbacks Lat 33-22 S Long 7-12 E.

Monday 2 Decr

First part moderate breeze from the Westward - Middle and latter same saw a hump back. Lat 33-33 S Lat 33-28 S Long 7-40 E Long 8-58 E.

Tuesday 3 Dec

First part fresh breezes from the Westward - middle and latter moderate Lat 33-28 S Long 8-58 E.

Wednesday 4 Dec

First part gentle breezes from the Westward - Middle and latter strong breezes from the W. Lat 33-09 S Long 9-28 E.

Thursday 5 Dec

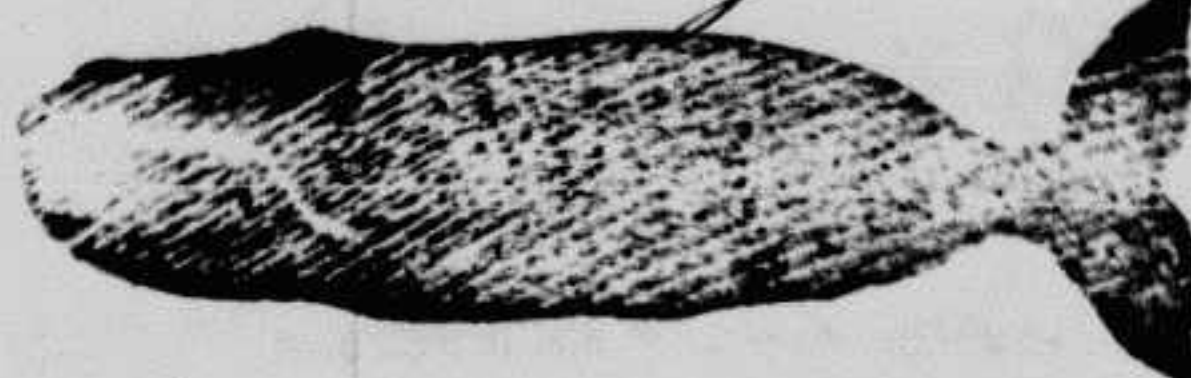
First part strong breezes from the Westward - Middle and latter light breezes from the W. Lat 32-20 S Long 9-45 E.

Friday 6 Dec

First part moderate breeze from the W. - Middle light winds from W to NW latter light airs from NW to SE and Calms. Lat 31-34 S Long 11-40 E.

Saturday 7 Dec 1867

First part calm - Middle and latter light airs from S to E. at 10 A.M. saw and lowered the Boats for a Right Whale at 11 got fast at noon when he dead and Boats towing. Lat 30-34 S Long 10-30 E.



Sunday 8 Dec

First part light airs from the South at 2 P.M. got the Whale alongside at 3 hooked on, at 6 finished cutting at sunset saw another Right Whale but too late to lower - Middle and latter light winds saw Finback Lat 30-15 S Long 10-30 E.

Monday 9 Dec

First part fresh breezes from the Westward - Middle and latter same Lat 30-24 S Long 10-41 E.

Tuesday 10 Dec

First part fresh breezes from S.W. at 5 P.M. finished boiling Middle and latter moderate breezes saw a steamer steering for the Cape Lat 30-28 S Long 11-12 E.

Wednesday 11 Dec

First part fresh breezes from S E to SE - Middle and latter fresh breezes from the South stowed down the oil Lat 30-58 S Long 9-40 E.

Thursday 12 Dec

First part fresh breezes from the South - Middle and latter the same ship heading to the Westward at 6 A.M. saw a large sperm whale
