First part fresh
Grades and fine weather saw
Merchantman at P.M. finished
boiling Middle and latter pleasant
Grades and good weather Lat 11° 21' S.
Long 11° 09' W.

Friday 27 March

First part moderate
Grades one sail seen Middle
and latter fresh Grades and fair
weather to path P.M. saw Whales
to leeward going quick suppose
the ship had been foul of them
before daylight lowered the Boats
but could not get up with them
then came on board at 11 lower
ed again and got one small
one thus ends two Boats
chasing to windward Lat 10° 45' S.
Long 10° 45' W.

Saturday 28 March

First part fine weather
at 2 P.M. took the whale to
the ship and cut him in
Middle and latter fresh Grades
in the morning commenced
boiling Lat 10° 37' S.
by sun Long 11° 14' W.
by chron " 10° 47' W.

Sunday 29 March

First part moderate Grades
at P.M. finished boiling Middle
and latter fresh Grades and fair
weather stowed down the oil
Lat 11° 08' S
Long 11° 00' W.

Monday 30 March

First part pleasant Grades
Middle and latter fresh Grades and
saw Merchantman Lat 11° 16' S.
Long 11° 16' W.

Tuesday 31 March

First part fresh Grades
Middle and latter same saw one
sail Lat 10° 41' S.
Long 11° 05' W.

Wednesday 1 April

First part fresh Grades
Middle and latter moderate
Grades and fine weather Lat 9° 37' S.
Long 12° 00' W.

Thursday 2 April

First part moderate Grades
and fine Middle and latter same
saw one Merchantman Lat 9° 11' S.
Long 13° 05' W.

Friday 3 April

First part fresh Grades Middle
and latter same saw nothing
Lat 8° 11' S.
Long 13° 25' W.

Saturday 4 April

First part gentle Grades
at 4 P.M. saw the Sloop of Assencion
by aback through the night latter
strong Grades ship running off past the
Island saw one sail Lat 7° 59' S.
Long 14° 34' W.

Sunday 5 April

First part strong Grades
ships course - N.W. Middle fresh Grades
with some rain latter moderate
Grades saw one sail Lat 6° 47' S.
Long 15° 12' W.
