

Wednesday 3 June 1858

First part light winds
from S.E. Middle same latter
light airs from S.E. to S.W. Ships
steaming after 9 A.M. N.P.W.
Lat 28-33 N
Long 55-57 W

Thursday 4 June

First part light airs
from S to S.W. Middle light
airs from S.W. to N.W. with showers
of rain latter very light airs
from S.W. Ships course N.P.W.
Two sails in sight Lat 29-19 N
Long 56-14 W

Friday 5 June

First part very light
airs from S.W. Middle very
light airs all around and Calms
latter light airs from the East
unbent Main Top Sail to
repair Lat 29-15 N
Long 56-42 W

Saturday 6 June

First part very light
airs from the Eastward one sail
in sight at 6 finished repairing
and bent Main Top Sail Middle
squally with rain Thunder and
lightning latter fresh breezes from
N.E. and N.E. by E Ships course N.P.W.
At 1/2 past 11 passed English Bank
Hudson Lat buoy N. Lat 30-48 N
Long 57-38 W

Sunday 7 June 1858

First part fresh breezes
from E & S Ships course N.P.W.
and N by W N.W. Middle and latter
same Lat 32-57 N
Long 59-24 W

Monday 8 June

First part fresh breezes
from the Eastward Ship steering
N by W N.W. and N by W Middle and
latter light winds from the Eastward
at sunset shortened sail for the
night saw two sail both Merchant
-man bound South Lat 31-31 N
Long 60-40 W

Tuesday June 9th

First part light airs
from E to N.E. Ship on Starboard
tack Middle and latter same

Wednesday 10 June

First part light airs
and pleasant Middle and latter
same Lat 30-16 N
Long 60-55 W

Thursday 11 June

First part light airs
and pleasant weather picked up
40 Gallons Carosene one sail in
sight Middle and latter same
picked up 4 Cask Petroleum
Lat 30-38 N
Long 60-28 W

Friday 12 June

First part light airs saw seven
- at Merchantman Middle fresh breezes
latter strong breeze from the South
Lat 31-22 N
Long 60-56 W
