employed repairing Main Sail
Middle and latter very light airs
from N.W. & to East and Calm

Wednesday July 1

First part very light
airs from the Eastward and Calm
finished repairing and bent
Main Sail Middle and latter
light winds and fine weather at 10
A.M. lowered for a large Spinn
Whale & past got fast and killed
the ~~Whale~~ Three Whalers Two
Schooners and a Brig in sight

Lat 30° 48' N
Long 50° 30' W

Thursday July 2

First part moderate
winds from the Eastward & past 2 P.M.
got the Whale to the ship at 4 com-
menced cutting at 9 P.M. got the
head off and the jaw on deck at
8 A.M. commenced cutting at 4 P.M.
& got the Blubber on deck at noon got
got in the junk Lat 30° 51' N

Long 50° 56' W
