

Friday 3 July 1858

Commenced heaving  
up the Case and bailing the same  
at 4 P.M. commenced bailing  
Middle and latter fresh breezes  
from E to N one Merchant Brig  
in sight Lat 30° 44' N  
Long 50° 31' W

Saturday 4 July

First part Moderate  
breezes from the North all  
hands employed Bailing and  
cutting blubber &c Middle and  
latter mostly moderate breezes  
employed Bailing Lat 30° 37' N  
Long 50° 11' W

Sunday 5 July

First part moderate and  
fine 5 Whalers in sight  
employed Bailing Middle and  
latter light airs and calm at  
5 A.M. finished Bailing and stow-  
ed about 50 Bbls oil in ground  
Two Barkes Two Brigs and one  
Schooner in sight Lat 30° 41'  
Long

Monday 6 July

First part calm at 8 P.M.  
Capt Perry came on board from Brig  
Industria of Barbadoes one Month  
out 12 Bbls Middle and latter mostly  
calm stowed down the remainder  
of the oil Lat 30° 25' N  
Long 50° 32' W

Tuesday 7 July 1858

First part squally and  
rainy Two Sail in sight Middle and  
latter same Lat 30° 33' N  
Long 50° 42' W

Wednesday 8 July

First part light airs  
from East to S.W. and fair weather  
Two Sail in sight Middle and latter  
mostly calm Three Sail in sight  
Lat 30° 45' N  
Long 50° 51' W

Thursday 9 July

First part light airs and  
calms Middle and latter light breezes  
from S.W. to N Two Sail in sight  
Lat 31° 00' N  
Long 51° 10' W

Friday 10 July

First part light breezes  
from the S.W. with rain squalls  
Middle and latter moderate breezes  
from the South Westward the Brig  
Industria in sight Lat 31° 32' N  
Long 51° 11' W

Saturday 11 July

First part gentle breezes  
from S.W. 5 Whalers in sight  
at 2 P.M. spoke Schooner Clarence  
Provincetown N. S. spoke Sch. Samson  
at Blake Hammond - Marion Middle  
and latter squally and rainy  
with thunder and lightning
