

Sunday 12 July 1858

First part strong winds from S W and rugged squally weather at 5 P M spoke Bark Atlantic. Crew. New Bedford two months out. Clear Middle squally latter strong breeze from S W by S. M. Lat 30° 48' N Long 49° 38' W

Monday 13 July

First part strong breeze from S W by S. Middle and latter same saw two sail Lat Long

Tuesday 14 July

First part strong winds from S W and rugged at 3 P M wind shifted to the W in a squall two sail in sight. Middle and latter wind S W and S W and squally the Brig Inman in sight. Lat 30° 42' N Long 49° 42' W

Wednesday 15 July

First part moderate breezes from S W and fair weather. Middle same latter strong breezes from the S E several sails seen both whalers and merchantmen. Lat 29° 59' N Long 50° 20' W

Thursday 16 July

First part strong breezes from S E. Middle and latter same Lat 30° 02' N Long 51° 03' W

Friday 17 July 1858

All these 24 hours fresh breezes from S E to E.

Saturday 18 July

First part moderate breezes from the Eastward. Middle same latter fresh breezes from the Eastward saw several whalers and one merchantman. Lat 30° 51' N Long 51° 02' W

Sunday 19 July

First part fresh breezes from the Eastward one whaler and one merchantman in sight. Middle and latter gentle breezes from the Eastward several whalers in sight. Lat 31° 57' N Long 51° 12' W

Monday 20 July

First part gentle breezes from the Eastward. Middle and latter same saw two whalers. Lat 31° 59' N Long 51° 20' W

Tuesday 21 July

First part gentle breezes from the Eastward. Middle and latter very light airs from the Eastward passed one whaling schooner. Lat 31° 44' N Long 51° 35' W

Wednesday 22 July

First very light variable airs and calms. Middle same latter light breezes from S W and S W by S saw four whalers. Lat 31° 35' N Long 52° 00' W
