

Thursday 3 Sept 1858

First part fresh breezes
and rugged at 4 past 12 got fast to
and killed two Whales 
at 1 got them to the ship
and cut them in got
one Boat Stove Middle and latter
light airs from N to S W A strong
Current setting to the S. E. Employed
Boiling Lat 38-40 N
Long 68-35 W

Friday 4 Sept

First part mostly calm
Finished Boiling - Middle and
latter moderate breezes from S W
to East saw two Seals. Stowed
down the Oil &c Lat 37-03 N
Long 69-32 W

Saturday 5 Sept

First part fresh breezes
from E. to N E with a heavy swell
from the South - Middle fresh
Gales from E. N. E. and sun
squally latter strong winds from
N E to N with a very heavy swell
from the S. Ship on Starboard tack
Lat 38-35 N
Long 70-48 W

Sunday 6 Sept

First part fresh Gales
from N by W and N W Ship on
Starboard tack saw one Seal
Middle strong breezes N at W to S W
Ship on Starboard tack latter major
- at winds from the N W
Lat 39-09 N
Long 70-42 W

Monday 7 Sept 1858

First part fresh breezes from
the Westward steered N by W - Middle light
winds from N S W latter fresh breezes
from S W to S by W saw a number of
Sail saw two N York Pilot Boats
Lat 40-43 N
Long 71-18 W

Tuesday 8 Sept

First part commences
with fresh winds from the South at 1
P. M. had a Thunder Squall with much
rain wind to the South at 3 it cleared
away and the wind hauled to S W
steered N by W W at sunset blowing
heavy wore ship and headed S by W Middle
squally and blowing heavy with much
lightning wind from W by S to N E.
Ship on Starboard tack latter strong
winds from N E. Ship heading N at W
at 11 A. M. saw Long Island Montez Light
house bearing S.

Wednesday 9 Sept

First part Calm at 4 P. M.
a light air from the S. E. steered S. E.
