

Journal of A Voyage from New London
 On the Schooner *Cornelia* Lorenzo O Baker Master
 Sailed May 31st 1868

Sunday May 31st 1868 Commenced with thick fog at 6 AM
 lights up get under way near Race Point
 with light winds from N.W. and pleasant
 and stood out to sea at Narragansett Montauk
 Point bearing 17 four miles sent out looking
 stored anchors &c So Ends this day

Monday June 1st First part light and pleasant winds
 from the N.W. Steady S.W. & all sail out saw many
 sails at 5 PM saw Blackfish lowered and chased
 until sunset but without success middle and
 latter part light and pleasant sea smooth sky
 clear Barometer 29.50, So Ends

Tuesday June 2nd Throughout these 24 hours light and pleasant
 winds from the Westward sea smooth and sky
 clear saw several sail at different points
 at 1 PM saw a school of Blackfish lowered
 but without success hand employed at this
 duty So Ends Lat 39.16 Long 69.30 West

Wednesday June 3rd These 24 hours being and ends
 with fresh gales from the Eastward with
 rain a head on on line under double reef
 sails So Ends had sails in sight at 6 PM

Thursday 4th Throughout these 24 hours strong gales
 from the Eastward and rain with
 a heavy sea on under double reef sails
 So Ends nothing in sight at 6 PM

Friday 5th Beginning with fresh gales from the
 East and pleasant heading to the
 S.E. at 10 AM saw ships to the S.E.
 middle and latter more moderate
 So Ends No logs

To Hudsons Bay And Cumberland Inlet in

Saturday June 6th These 24 hours being fine pleasant
 weather Windy from S.E. heading to the S.E.
 middle and latter part light and pleasant
 with a heavy sea on all sail out So Ends
 Lat 39.10 N Long by Chron 68.28 W

Sunday 7th Throughout these 24 hours light and pleasant
 winds from the S.E. heading to the N.E.
 all sail out with a heavy swell from the
 Eastward saw two sail to the Westward
 steering to the S.E. So Ends this day
 Lat by Chron 39.30 Long by Chron 62.18 West

Monday 8th These 24 hours being and ends with strong
 winds from S.E. and pleasant heading to the
 N.E. saw a Whaling Barque heading to the
 N.E. middle part squally with a heavy sea
 on under double reef So Ends
 Lat by Chron 38.56 N Long by Chron 58.53 West

Tuesday 9th These 24 hours being with strong winds
 from the S.E. and pleasant heading to the
 N.E. under double reef sails middle part
 moderate latter part light winds and pleas
 ant all sail out then sails in sight
 Lat by Chron 38.56 N Long by Chron 58.15 West

Wednesday 10th These 24 hours being with light winds
 from S.E. and pleasant heading to the S.E.
 at 6 PM spoke the Cape Han Pigeon of Dartmouth
 with 2 years out 4100 lbs Sperm middle and
 latter part fresh gales and squally
 So Ends Lat by Chron 38.46 N

Thursday 11th These 24 hours being with strong winds from
 S.E. heading to the Eastward middle and latter part
 more moderate wind hauled to N.W. with fine weather
 made all sail a fair wind for the first time
 since leaving home So Ends
 Lat by Chron 40.09 N Long by Chron 52.58 West
