

Tuesday the 23rd June 1868 These 24 hours begin with light winds from the South heading to West. W. with a smooth sea all sail out at 5 P.M. saw a sail to the Northward latter part fresh winds with a rough sea. So Ends nothing in sight.
Lat by obs 40.56 N Long by Chron 43.17 W

Wednesday 24 These 24 hours begin and ends with light winds from the Westward heading to West. W. with all sail out nothing in sight. So Ends
Lat by obs 41.04 N Long by Chron 43.12 W

Thursday 25th These 24 hours begin with light winds and pleasant heading to West. W. at 6 P.M. saw a sail steering to the Eastward at 10 P.M. wind hauls to the N.W. in a small middle part fresh winds with squalls at 10 A.M. made to the S.W. saw a Dutch Brig steering to the Eastward. So Ends Lat by obs 41.53 N

Friday 26th These 24 hours begin with fresh winds from the Westward sky overcast every appearance of rain middle part much the same latter part pleasant saw two sail steering to the Ends. So Ends
Lat by obs 41.50 N Long by Chron 43.03 W

Saturday 27th These 24 hours begin with light winds from S.W. steering to West. W. middle light winds are calmer latter part light winds from the Westward sky overcast sea smooth saw several sail steering to the Eastward. So Ends do obs

Sunday 28th These 24 hours begin with fresh winds from S.W. and rain. Look in sail middle part light with a heavy swell on at 11 P.M. saw a Steamer steering to the East at daylight saw an iceberg at 8 A.M. for light up to Blackfish Island but without success saw several sails steering to the East. So Ends this day
Lat by obs 43.12 N Long by Chron 43.10 W

Monday 29th These 24 hours begin with light winds from S.W. and pleasant heading to S.W. saw Bl. k. f. however (saw) got two shortened sail middle and latter part fresh winds from the Northward and cloudy sun Blackfish Island but without success saw two sails and two Ice Bergs. So Ends do obs

Tuesday 30th These 24 hours begin with fresh winds from S.W. and equally heading to the Westward at 6 P.M. saw ship saw two sail and three Ice Berg middle and latter part more moderate wind sails to S.E. So Ends
Lat by obs 42.50 N Long by Chron 43.48 W

Wednesday July 1st All of these 24 hours light and pleasant winds from S.E. heading to North saw ship to Horn of Cape very plenty. Saw two sail steering to the East at daylight commenced boiling at 4 A.M. wind hauls to S.E. with fine pleasant weather. So Ends three Ice bergs in sight
Lat by obs 43.38 N Long by Chron 43.53 W

Thursday 2nd These 24 hours light winds from S.E. and pleasant heading to S.W. with all sail out saw three sails steering to the Eastward at 6 P.M. saw an iceberg to the Westward. So Ends this day
Lat by obs 42.02 N Long by Chron 43.45 W

Friday 3rd These 24 hours fresh winds from S.E. and pleasant heading to the Southward sea rough sky clear Barometer standing at 30 hands employed at 10.30 duty at 6 A.M. worship to the S.E. under short sail blows on to fresh gales. So Ends nothing in sight
Lat by obs 41.26 N Long by Chron 43.29 W
