

Saturday July 4th 1868 These 24 hours begin with strong winds from the Southward and pleasant heading to the N.E. at 6 P.M. ran a sail to the N.E. middle and latter part light winds and calms all sail out at 6 P.M. saw an Tubery S. Ends this day
Lat by obs 41° 33' N Long by Chron 48° 33' W

Sunday 5 These 24 hours begin with light winds from the S.E. and pleasant heading to the N.E. with all sail out middle part calm latter light winds from the Southward with thick fog steering N.E. & E. S. Ends this day No obs

Monday 6 These 24 hours begin and ends with fresh winds from S.W. with thick fog steering N.E. & N. with all sail out hauls employed at ships day S. Ends this day No obs

Tuesday 7 These 24 hours begin with fresh winds from the S. steering N.E. with all sail out middle part moderate and wind latter part spoke an English ship bound to Europe and sent her by her light winds from the Eastward and pleasant S. Ends
Lat by obs 46° 10' N Long by Chron 48° 12' W

Wednesday 8 These 24 hours begin with light winds from the S.E. and pleasant middle part calms with fog latter part light airs from S.W. steering N.E. with all sail out S. Ends one sail in sight
Lat by obs 47° 27' N Long by Chron 48° 26' W

Thursday 9 These 24 hours begin and ends with light winds from different points of the Compass and calms steering N.E. with all sail out at 2 P.M. saw a Steamer steering to the Westward saw a sail to the N.E. S. Ends
Lat by obs 48° 08' N Long by Chron 48° 02' W

Friday July 10th 1868 These 24 hours begin and ends with light and baffling winds from different points of the Compass steering N.E. & N. and several Tubery middle and latter part thick fog S. Ends No obs

Saturday 11 These 24 hours begin with light winds and calms with thick fog steering N.E. middle part light winds from the Northward and clear at 6 P.M. saw a Steamer ship steering to the Eastward saw several Tubery latter part fresh winds with an overcast sky S. Ends this day
Lat by obs 49° 08' N Long by Chron 48° 48' W

Sunday 12 These 24 hours light winds from N.E. and calms with thick fog heading to the N.W. with all sail out at 6 P.M. tacked to the Eastward at 11 P.M. tacked back again latter part clear saw several Tubery S. Ends this day
Lat by obs 49° 10' N Long by Chron 48° 56' W

Monday 13 These 24 hours begin and ends with light winds from the Eastward and pleasant sea smooth the clear steering N.E. by N. with all sail out saw fifty Tubery and fifteen S. to the West as far as could see from the Northeast S. Ends
Lat by obs 50° 19' N Long by Chron 49° 08' 3/4 W

Tuesday 14 These 24 hours begin with light winds from the Southward and fine pleasant weather middle part much the same passed 49 Tubery latter part mist hauls to the Northward with inside S. Ends No obs

Wednesday 15 These 24 hours begin with light winds from the Eastward with light rains heading to the Northward middle part calm with fog latter part light winds from the Southward and clear all sail out S. Ends
Lat by obs 52° 11' N Long by Chron 49° 03' W
