

- Thursday 16th July 1868 These 24 hours being with fresh winds from the Southward with heavy rains steering N by E with all sail out at 7 P.M. shortened sail middle part much the same latter part wind hauls to N.E. and clears up So. Ends nothing in sight
Lat by obs 53.39 N Long by Chron 50.43 W
- Friday 17th These 24 hours being with light winds from the N.E. and pleasant heading to the Northward with all sail out at 6 P.M. wind hauls to the Westward tacked to N.E. wind from S.W. and fresh all sail out wind freshening So. Ends this day nothing in sight
Lat by obs 55.12 N Long by Chron 51.20 W
- Saturday 18th These 24 hours being with fresh gales from N.W. and squally steering N by E at 3 P.M. double reefed the sails middle part more moderate made all sail latter part wind hauls to N.W. fresh and clear So. Ends
Lat by obs 57.34 N Long by Chron 51.24 W
- Sunday 19th These 24 hours being and ends with strong winds from N.W. and squally heading to the N.E. at 4 P.M. double reefed the Main sail and took in the Fore top sail and Staying pile So. Ends this day nothing in sight
Lat by obs 59.24 N Long by Chron 50.36 W
- Monday 20th These 24 hours being and ends with strong winds from N.W. and squally heading to N.E. at 4 P.M. saw a sail to the Eastward at 11 P.M. tacked to the Westward middle and latter part strong winds one sail in sight So. Ends
Lat by obs 57.12 N Long by Chron 51.47 W
- Tuesday 21th These 24 hours strong gales from N.W. with heavy steering N by W under double reef middle and latter part much the same So. Ends one sail in sight its obs

- Wednesday 22nd July 1868 These 24 hours being with strong gales from N.W. with rain steering N by W under double reefs at 6 P.M. exchanged Long with the Scotch Brig Lord Sulcan middle part hauls to S.W. with strong winds latter part moderate with fog So. Ends No obs
- Thursday 23rd These 24 hours being and ends with strong gales from the Northward with rain squalls and thick weather heading to the Westward under double reefs So. Ends this day nothing in sight No obs
- Friday 24th These 24 hours being with fresh gales from the Northward and rainy heading to the Westward middle part much the same latter part wind hauls to N.W. and clears up tacked to the N.E. saw several Icebergs So. Ends Lat by obs 57.42 N Long by Chron 51.17 W
- Saturday 25th These 24 hours being with light winds from the Westward and pleasant heading to the Westward with all sail out middle part calm latter part light air from the Southward and pleasant steering N by W So. Ends several Icebergs in sight Lat 59.54 N Long 60.13 W
- Sunday 26th These 24 hours being with light winds from the Southward and pleasant steering N by W at 4 P.M. came into the pack ice middle part run to the North along the Ice latter part calm the pack in sight
Lat by obs 60.32 N Long by Chron 61.37 W
- Monday 27th These 24 hours being and ends with light air from the Westward and calm heading to the Northward with a thousand and one Icebergs in sight hands employed at ships duty So. Ends this day
Lat by obs 60.57 N Long by Chron 61.53 W
