

Sunday 23 Aug 1868 These 24 hours begins and ends with light winds from S E and hazy at 1 P.M. got under way with the Ansel Gibbs and stood out of the bay So Ends

Monday 24 These 24 hours begins and ends with light winds from S E with an overcast sky middle part calm latter part same saw several Whales lowered and got four So Ends

Tuesday 25 These 24 hours begins with light winds from the Northward and calm, middle and latter part much the same as 4 P.M. saw four Whales lowered struck and killed one took her along side and cut her in So Ends

Wednesday 26 These 24 begins and ends with light winds from S E and pleasant working down the Whalom So Ends nothing in sight

Thursday 27 These 24 hours begins with heavy gales from S E with heavy rain at 6 P.M. and hours to 11 and clearing up middle and latter part strong gales and clear saw three Whales going to the Northward So Ends the Ansel Gibbs in sight Whale Point bearing N W Dist 20 miles

Friday 28 These 24 hours begins with light winds from the Northward and pleasant saw Whales lowered but without success Whale Point bearing N W Dist 12 miles middle and latter part calm saw Whales lowered but without success So Ends

Saturday 29 These 24 hours begins with light winds from S W saw Whales lowered but without success middle and latter part light winds from the Northward at 4 P.M. finished boring and stowed down So Ends Ansel Gibbs in sight

Sunday 30 August 1868 These 24 hours fresh winds from the S W and pleasant cruising off Whale Point middle and latter part much the same as 4 P.M. saw Whales lowered and chased So Ends

Monday 31 These 24 light winds from different Points of the Compass saw two Whales lowered and chased but without success So Ends

Tuesday 1 September 1868 These 24 hours light winds from different Points of the Compass saw two Whales lowered but without success So Ends

Wednesday 2 These 24 hours begins with light winds from S W running up along the land middle and latter part fresh winds at 4 P.M. saw a Whale lowered but without success So Ends the Gibbs in sight

Thursday 3 These 24 hours begins with fresh gales from S W and pleasant middle much the same latter part light winds with rain and very heavy haze breasted So Ends the land in sight So Ends

Friday 4 These 24 hours begins with light winds from the S W with hazy weather standing off and on the land middle much the same latter part light winds from S W and pleasant So Ends

Saturday 5 These 24 hours begins and ends with fresh winds from the Northward with hail squalls at 10 A.M. ran down as far as Depot Island saw nothing started and stood back to the Eastward again So Ends

Sunday 6 These 24 hours light winds from S E and pleasant with calms working up the land towards Whale Point saw nothing So Ends
