

Monday 7th September 1868

- Monday 7th These 24 hours begins with light winds and pleasant middle and latter part strong gales from S & E and rainy heading S & E under Short Sail to Ende
- Tuesday 8 These 24 hours begins with heavy gales from S & E with heavy rains middle much the same latter part moderate with a heavy swell on the Ende
Lat 63.21 N Long by Chron 88.43 W
- Wednesday 9 These 24 hours begins with light winds from S & E with fog and calms with a heavy swell on at 11 PM wind hauls to it & with rain middle and latter part fresh gales with rain to Ende land in sight
- Thursday 10 These 24 hours strong gales from N & W and squally heading off and on the land to Ende
- Friday 11 All of these 24 hours strong gales from N & W with squalls heading off and on the land to Ende
- Saturday 12 Begins with fresh gales from N & W middle and latter part moderate stood in under Whale Point saw nothing at 7 AM spoke the Ansel Gibbs, Whales to Ende
- Sunday 13 These 24 hours begins with light winds from the West and steering up the Welcome in company with the Gibbs bound to Repulse Bay at 10 AM wind hauls to the Northward to Ende
- Monday 14 These 24 hours strong winds from N beating up the Welcome in company with the Ansel Gibbs to Ende this day at 6 AM anchored in Feline Harbor strong gales from the South with snow
- Tuesday 15 These 24 hours strong gales from S & W and snow boats out looking for Whales saw two but without success to Ende

- Wednesday 16 First part these 24 hours light winds and fine weather middle and latter part strong gales from the N with snow boats out looking for Whales saw one to Ende
- Thursday 17 First part strong gales from N with snow middle and latter part fine boats out looking for Whales saw nothing at 10 AM came on board and got under way with the Gibbs and steered down the Welcome to Ende this day
- Friday 18 These 24 strong gales from N with snow ran down the Welcome until 4 PM luffed too and rounded back and forth across the Welcome blowing and snowing like Feline to Ende
- Saturday 19 These 24 hours fresh winds from North with squalls of snow and cold saw several Whales hoard struck and killed one took him alongside and cut her in at 6 AM commenced boiling saw whales liver oil but without success to Ende this day
- Sunday 20 These 24 hours fresh winds from the North and cold Ice making fresh middle part fresh winds and cold latter part the same saw Whales lowered struck and hoard to Ende the Gibbs in sight
- Monday 21 These 24 hours fresh winds from the North and cold at 8 PM spoke the Gibbs middle and latter part the same at 6 AM saw lowered but without success came on board left the Welcome and kept off for Marble Island at 9 AM finished boiling and steered down to Ende
- Tuesday 22 These 24 hours begins with fresh winds from the North with squalls of snow passing of Fox Marble Island at 10 PM luffed too at daylight ran off a gun made Cape Jolivet latter part strong gales saw several Whales at Marsden made Marble Island bearing N & W dist 20 miles to Ende
