

- Wednesday 23 Sept 1868 These 24 hours begin with fresh gales from the North and galeons at 4 P.M. came to anchor off the Harbor at Marble Island in 5 1/2 fathoms of water in company with the Ansel Gilly middle and latter part strong gales with snow So Ends
- Thursday 24 These 24 hours heavy gales from the North with snow at Anchor off Marble Island Harbor So Ends
- Friday 25 Wind part heavy gales from N.W. with snow middle same latter part more moderate went down to the East end with two boats saw one Whale So Ends
- Saturday 26 These 24 hours begin with fresh gales from the N.W. middle moderate latter part wind heavy to N.W. got under way and went in to the Harbor got ashore going in and anchored in 18 fathoms of water in company with the Ansel Gilly So Ends
- Sunday 27 These 24 hours begin with fresh winds from the south very appearance of bad weather middle much the same at 2 P.M. wind hauls to the Northward with strong gales and snow So Ends in a Snow Harbor
- Monday 28 These 24 hours begin with fresh gales from North with snow middle more moderate latter part light winds from the South with occasional snow squalls at 7 A.M. two boats went from each vessel to the Main to look for Natives So Ends this day pumping off water on the hull and getting ready for winter
- Tuesday 29 These 24 hours begin with light winds from the Eastward and pleasant middle and latter part fresh from Northward So Ends

- Wednesday 30 Sept 1868 Throughout these 24 hours fresh winds from the N.W. and clear middle and latter part the same hands employed in getting ready for winter So Ends
- Thursday 1 Oct 1868 All of these 24 hours fresh winds from N.W. and clear hands employed in getting ready for winter two boats over to the Main So Ends
- Friday 2 Oct These 24 hours begin with strong gales from N.W. and clear middle much the same latter part wind light and hauls to N.W. shove up the Anchors and secured the Chains So Ends this day
- Saturday 3 These 24 hours begin with fresh gales from the North with snow middle part light winds from the Eastward latter part light winds from S.E. with snow So Ends this day
- Sunday 4 These 24 hours begin with fresh gales from the S.E. with snow middle part more wind hauls to N.E. latter part heavy gales from N.E. with an overcast sky at daylight upon the vessel that whole length of the Chain So Ends
- Monday 5 These 24 hours begin and ends with heavy gales from North to N.W. See making fast on the vessel boats not returned yet look for them the first fair day So Ends all ready for winter
- Tuesday 6 These 24 hours begin and ends with heavy gales from N.W. with squalls of snow both Anchors ahead with 20 fathoms of Chain out on each Anchor boats not returned yet So Ends this day
- Wednesday 7 All of these 24 hours strong gales from N.W. with snow squalls at 9 A.M. boats returned after an absence of nine days all covered with Ice So Ends this
