

- Thursday 8 Oct 1868 First part of these 24 hours heavy heavy gales from N.W. middle part more moderate latter part wind hauls to N.E. with snow So Ends this day
- Friday 9 These 24 hours begins and ends with fresh winds from N.W. boats out looking for Whobs & gunning have in 10 to 40 fathoms of the Anchors So Ends
- Saturday 10 These 24 hours light winds from S.W. and pleasant part ashore cutting ice for the winter the other two boats off at Dunking and Sealing So Ends this day
- Sunday 11 These 24 hour fresh winds from the S.W. and heavy snow a boat that we found on the East end of the Island So Ends
- Monday 12 These 24 hours begins and ends with light winds from S.W. with snow squalls nothing of note occurred So Ends
- Tuesday 13 These 24 hours strong winds from N.W. men ashore cutting ice the Carpenter repairing the boat that was picked up So Ends
- Wednesday 14 These 24 hours strong winds from N.W. with snow squalls men out a canoe So Ends
- Thursday 15 These 24 hours strong gales from N.E. with spells of snow and very cold harbor not far over So Ends this day
- Friday 16 These 24 hours strong winds from N.W. with very cold weather the air full of frost middle and latter more moderate So Ends

- Saturday 17 Oct 1868 These 24 hours begins with fresh gales from N.E. with squalls of snow middle and latter part pleasant went around the Island gunning So Ends
- Sunday 18 First part light winds from the S. and pleasant middle and latter part strong winds with snow So Ends this day
- Monday 19 Throughout these 24 hours strong gales from the North with snow squalls and very cold every appearance of freezing the harbor over if the winds should go down So Ends this day
- Tuesday 20 All of these 24 hours strong gales from the N.W. with spells of snow weather very cold harbor about freezing up So Ends
- Wednesday 21 First part fresh gales from N.W. harbor freezing up middle and latter part light winds and pleasant Harbor froze over took both Anchors and cut the vessels down and lost too the passage for winter So Ends
- Thursday 22 Begins with light winds from the N.W. and pleasant middle and latter part wind hauls to the South hauls the vessel over for the winter So Ends
- Friday 23 Begins and ends with fresh winds from the S.W. see a thawing sky overcast Barometer going down every appearance of a West wind So Ends
- Saturday 24 All of these 24 hours strong gales from the N.W. with very cold weather ships frozen solid So Ends this day
