zero all in good health. No serious diseases
and no more symptoms at present one
family of natives killed down by the great
Gibbs Hill Pickensmouth and Gumbo End.

1 to 14. Strong gales, from different points
of the compass, with bad weather. Strong

compass. Wind ranging from zero to
30. Very belated. March has been very
up to the present day. The End

From 14th to 21st Strong gales from different points of the compass mostly from N.W. The ranging to about 15 to 20 below zero, 16th went a gunning saw two Walrus on the Ice crawled about to them and shot one dead he fell off the Ice and sunk no more Actives arrived as yet to day quite mild 21st The standing at 10 above went a gunning and got three large ducks, G. Ent all well no more appearance of Scurvy as yet

From 21st to 28th strong winds from different points of the Compass & the
ranging from zero to 20 below, Wednesday, Mr. Chester
and four others went over to the Main land.
hunting Deer saw several being thick and blizzed
did not get any arrived back today the 28th no more
Satives makes their appearance as yet & our men still
holding off to Ensis see no Water for Ice from the
hills.

June 28 to 31 strong gales and bad weather most of the time. Her ranging from 10 to 20 below zero she ^{was} out the Hatter out of the ice of Sever as yet makes its appearance

Harbor March 8th 1867

April 14 to Sunday is mostly light wind, from the south
and fine weather - most of the time Friday the 20th
two natives came over to the ship, but brought
nothing. Richard Mowth killed a Walrus on
the ice but lost him. He Encls. The station
at 15 above zero snow begins to give in the Sun

From 4 to 11th light winds from different points of the compass with light snow most of the time the ranging from 10 below to 20 above zero. On 6th the Great Gulls come up out of her bed cut through the ice around the boat, no appearance of the vessel coming up out of her bed as yet. Yesterday Jimmy Threlson man and other natives came to this vessel but have brought but little to Enc. pleasant for the season.

11 to 15 " Light winds from different points of the Compass with very unsettled weather occasionally a snowy day the ranging from 15 above to 20 below zero the 17th took the boat off the vessel getting Boat ready to go to the N.E. End of the Island several Natives came to day with little meat and a few fish & Encls with a strong wind from the Southward

From 15th to 25th Light winds from different points of the
Compass with very unpleasant weather snow
every few hours the ranging from 30th to 35th above
several arrivals of natives with fish Meat and
skins no Water in sight from the hills
All well to End.

From 28 to 1st May, light winds from different points of the compass. 28th Apr Ice set off from the South side of the Lland. 28th & 29th carried down each day a boat load of stuff to the N & E end of the Lland to get ready for Whaling & Co. Enry.
