

Schooner Cornelia Cruising in

- Monday 18 These 24 hours begins and ends with light baffling winds from different points of the compass, running up the land as far as Wager River and back to Whale Point. Saw nothing. So Ends. Lat by obs 64.55.27
- Tuesday 19 These 24 hours begins with fresh winds from South beating down along the land at 5 P.M. had a heavy thunder squall from the Westward with rain, middle part fog, latter part clear wind from the North stirring to the S.W. along the land. So Ends. Lat by obs 64.55.27
- Wednesday 20 These 24 hours begins with light winds from S.E. and fine weather stirring along the land to the S.W. from Whale point middle part calm latter part light air from the Eastward with fog. So Ends.
- Thursday 21 These 24 hours begins with light winds from the Eastward with thick fog, tacking to the Westward middle part calm latter part clear and fine. Wind from the South stirring to the S.E. and in light. Lat by obs 63.50.1 Long by Chron 88.52.47
- Friday 22 These 24 hours begins and ends with light winds from S.E. and calm. Whale point in light. Saw no Whales. So Ends. Lat by obs 64.13.47
- Saturday 23 These 24 hours begins with light winds from the South and fine weather. Whale point bearing N 4 miles distant. Sent in a boat gunning. Shot the Bear middle and latter part light winds and thick fog at Meridian lights up. So Ends. No Whales in sight. So ends.

Kew's Welcome for Whales July 19th 1867

- Sunday 24 These 24 hours begins with light winds from different points of the compass, heading off one on the land at 1 P.M. two boats went on shore and shot one Bear middle and latter part light winds from the South and pleasant stirring up the Welcome. So Ends this day. Lat by obs 64.56.1 Long by Chron 86.59.17
- Monday 25 All of these 24 hours light winds from different points of the compass and calm, heading up the Welcome. Saw nothing. So Ends this day. So ends.
- Tuesday 26 Light air and calm, heading up the bay nothing in sight. So Ends. So ends.
- Wednesday 27 Light air from different points of the compass and calm, up in Kipulak Bay it being full of Ice had to come out again the Ice not broken up and did not look as though it would this season. So Ends. So ends.
- Thursday 28 Light air and calm, bound out met the Gibbs bound up myself sick with the Erysipelas sent for Capt Fisher to come on board and see me but he did not come very kind indeed. So Ends. So ends.
- Friday 29 Light air and calm, working down the Welcome. Saw three Whales going quick up the Welcome lowered but did not get hold. So Ends. Lat by obs 65.00.1
- Saturday 30 Light winds and calm, heading down along the land at 2 P.M. saw a Whale lowered the second mate struck killed the Whale took her alongside and cut her in middle and latter part light air and at 9 P.M. saw a Bear in the Water lowered and killed her. So Ends the Gibbs in sight. So ends.
