

Schooner *Cornelia* Cruising for

- Sunday 1 August These 24 hours begins and ends with heavy gales from the Eastward with heavy rain, hauling off and on the land to the Ends Gibbs in sight to 6
- Monday 2 First part heavy gales with rain middle same latter part more moderate and clear up at 4 AM started by fire and commenced hauling again to Ends Gibbs in sight Lat by obs 64.10 (A)
- Tuesday 3 All of these 24 hours light winds from the N E and fine weather working up along the land to the North hands employed at hauling at Anvik finished hauling to Ends Lat by obs 64.21 North
- Wednesday 4 All of these 24 hours light winds from different points of the Compass heading up the Welcome at 2 PM commenced stowing Water latter part all hands at work cleaning Bone to Ends Gibbs in sight Lat by obs 65.00 Long by Chron 86.35 W
- Thursday 5 All of these 24 hours light winds from different points of the Compass steering up through the narrows into Repulse Bay through the Ice to Ends this day
- Friday 6 These 24 hours begins with light winds from N E with heavy weather running through the Ice into Repulse Bay at 6 PM came to anchor in Island Harbor in 17 fathoms of Water Boats went off to look for Whales
- Saturday 7 These 24 hours begins and ends with light winds from N E with light rain boats out looking for Whales saw one but could not strike at 7 PM came on board at 5 AM went off again saw one Whale but could not strike latter part fresh rain with rain came on board for the day to Ends

Whales in Rows Welcome August 1869

- Sunday 8 These 24 hours begins and ends with light winds from N E with rain boats off cruising for Whales saw nothing to Ends
- Monday 9 to 13 still at anchor at Island Harbor fine weather the most of the time boats out looking for Whales saw three but could not strike the 13th the Gibbs gets under way to go down the Welcome Mr Hall on board for home to Ends this day to Ends
- Tuesday 13 to 16 light winds from the E and fine weather boats out looking for Whales saw one but could not strike Whales very scarce only once in a while one to Ends
- Wednesday 16 to 19 Light winds and fine weather boats out looking for Whales saw nothing at 3 AM 17th got under way and stood out of the Bay saw several Whales coming into the Bay stood back again and anchor saw two of the Gibbs boats run to York Bay and saw nothing came back to Repulse Bay to Ends boats out looking for Whales
- Thursday 19 to 23 Light winds and fine weather boats out looking for Whales saw two did not strike at 11 AM went away amongst the Nets at 22 Natives brought him off again got under way and stood out of the Harbor light winds and calm to Ends
- Friday 24 Throughout these 24 hours light winds from the Eastward and calm weather pushing out of the Bay at 6 PM saw two Whales going north to the north middle part for latter part clear with light winds from N W the Gibbs in sight to Ends Lat by obs 66.10 Long by Chron 86.28 W
