Wednesday 25 August These 24 hours begins and ends with light winds from the Eastward with thick weather and light rain. Staring down the welcome latter part lights up the hills in sight Lat 65 14 N

Thursday 26 These 24 hours begins and ends with light winds from the N.E. and fine weather. Staring down the welcome the hills in sight at 11 comes in thick fog. Luffe too about off Whale point. No Ends

Friday 27 These 24 hours begins with light winds from the Eastward with thick fog. Luffe off Whale point at 4 P.M. clears up. Middle and latter part rain. At 11 P.M. the Aniel is seen nothing. No Ends do so

Saturday 28 These 24 hours begins and ends with light winds from the N.E. with specks of fog. off and on the land in company with the hills. No Ends. No nothing.

Sunday 29 These 24 hours light winds from N.E. and fine weather at 4 P.M. left off for home. No nothing. No Ends this day.

Monday 30 These 24 hours begins and ends with light winds from the Westward and fine weather. Staring to the Eastward sounding occasionally 30 fathoms of water. Lat by obs 62 30 N Long by Chron 65 25 W

Tuesday 31 These 24 hours begins with light winds from N.W. and heavy at 1 P.M. saw the West coast of Southhampton. Middle and latter part thick fog. Lay by all night at daylight light up. Left off N.E. by compass. The hills in company. No Ends. Lat by obs 62 38 N Long by Chron 66 41 W

Welcome. Cruising for Whales Aug

Wednesday 1st Sept 1869 These 24 hours begins with light winds from the N.W. and fine weather at 4 P.M. came out through Even. Point by Cape Pembroke and steered over for the Diggins. Middle and latter part strong gales and thick weather at 11 A.M. made nothing. No could not fetch by at Marston. No nothing. No took in sail.

Thursday 2 First part heavy gales from the South and rain. Middle part same. Latter part moderate and lights up at 4 P.M. No nothing. No made sail at 7 A.M. saw Nottingham and just dragged along shore of it to the windward. No Ends. Hills in company. Lat by obs 62 34 N Long by Chron 66 20 W

Friday 3 First part of these 24 hours light winds from N.W. with fog. Steered to the East for Charles Island. Middle part light winds from the East with fog and rain. Latter part light winds from the Northward with rain and fog. The Aniel hills in company. No ends.

Saturday 4 First part light winds with rain and fog. Steered N.W. by compass. Middle part much the same. Latter part winds hauls to N.W. and clears up by spells at 1 P.M. made North Bluff bearing N.E. by E. dist 25 miles. No Ends. Lat by obs 62 34 N Long by Chron 66 11 W

Sunday 5 All of these 24 hours strong gales from the N.W. and gradually steering S. by compass. Under short sail passed several icebergs. The hills in company. No Ends. No land in sight. Lat by obs 61 03 N Long by Chron 66 04 W
