

Schooner Cornelia

Thursday 16 Sept 1869 These 24 hours begin with light winds from the N.E. with a heavy swell from the Westward at 1 P.M. boarded a fish boat fishing on the New Bank between Cape Baitbel and Cape Ann 7 miles off shore and got some cod fish at 2 P.M. strong winds from N.W. heading to S.W. middle and latter part same at 4 P.M. came near running into a Brig on the opposite tack So Ends this day
Lat by obs 45.10 N Long by Chron 54.35 W

Friday 17 These 24 hours begin with strong winds from N.W. middle part wind hauls to N.E. and middle made all sail latter part fresh and squally strong W by compass hauls employed in reaching So Ends this day
Lat by obs 45.33 N Long by Chron 57.54 W

Saturday 18 These 24 hours begin and ends with light winds from the N.E. and fine weather strong W by compass with all sail out at 4 P.M. saw a sail steering to the Eastward So Ends
Lat by obs 45.42 N Long by Chron 61.07 W

Sunday 19 These 24 hours begin with light winds from the N.E. and fine weather middle part calm at 6 A.M. light winds from the Southward heading to N.W. at 4 P.M. saw a Steamer steering to the Eastward So Ends this day
Lat by obs 45.23 N Long by Chron 62.04 W

Monday 20 These 24 hours begin with light winds from the Westward and N.W. heading W by N middle and latter part strong winds with rain squalls accompanied with much lightning at 6 A.M. wind heads off to N.W. by N So Ends So obs

Homeward Bound Sept 16 1869

Tuesday 21 Sept 1869 These 24 hours begin with strong winds from the N.W. and pleasant heading W by N at 6 P.M. spoke the Ship John Raine of St Johns at 13 middle and latter part moderate winds from N.E. and cloudy at Haridian saw several fishing Schooners on the Eastern edge of Georges Bank So Ends So obs

Wednesday 22 These 24 hours begin with light winds and hazy weather strong W by compass saw several fishing Schooners from Gloucester went on board of one the Gazelle and got some fish and paper middle and latter part light winds and fine weather So Ends this day
Lat by obs 45.13 N Long by Chron 68.25 W

Thursday 23 These 24 hours begin with light winds from the Eastward and hazy strong W by N middle part same latter part wind hauls to the Northward and clears up started up W by N saw several Steamers and two sail vessels So Ends
Lat by obs 45.45 N Long by Chron 69.44 W

Friday 24 These 24 hours begin and ends with light winds from the Eastward and fine weather strong W by N with all sail out at 11 A.M. made Martha's Vineyard Island bearing N at 11 dist 20 miles So Ends several dead in sight Lat by obs 45.58 N Long by Chron 70.58 W

Saturday 25 These 24 hours begin and ends with light winds from the South heading W by N at 6 P.M. made Block Island bearing W by N at 1 P.M. made Montauk light passed in between Block I and Montauk So Ends
