Saturday May 10th Came in with good breeze from the trades and clear weather scho^r on starboard tack on sails set heading N N West working towards Westward, this day we finish packing and finished harp^{ing} on Harbo^r and Boat sail, pumps attended to, Lat 24.12 Long 40.00 West

Sunday May 11th Came in with good trade and clear weather all sails set Steaming N N West pumps attended to, Lat 25.15 Long 41.57

Monday May 12th Came in with nice breeze from the trades and clear weather on sails, set on starboard tack Steaming N N West, Brochant Flour Basha and Hart new Barrel of Park, and Paul cooler, pumps attended to, Lat 27.02 Long ~~41.57~~ 43.39 West

Tuesday May 13th Came in with good weather all throughout of this day an clear weather scho^r, on starboard tack Steaming N N West we bent new starboard Boat sail and reg up men gran for Dolphin on Western Browⁿ, pumps attended to, Lat 28.12 Long 45.12 West

Wednesday May 14th Came in with good breeze from the Eastward and clear weather, scho^r on starboard tack Steaming North crew fixing up chafing gears and other jobs at sun down took in sails pumps attended to, Lat 29.58 Long 46.37 West

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Thursday May 15th Came in with squally weather wind from East, scho^r running off all day Steaming North at noon got ship Steaming West, saw Ambloque going East at sun down took in flying jib, and pumps attended to, Lat 31.00 Long 47.16 West

Friday May 16th first part of this day came in with rain squalls and cloudy weather scho^r on port tack under main topsail fore sail and jib Steaming W by North at 7.30 am set flying jib and saw Hambroque saw and call going East in afternoon spoke scho^r Mary E Simmons with 100 B sawe left Bravo, pumps attended to, Lat 31.12 Long 49.03 West Mary E Simmons Long 49.57 1/2

Saturday May 17th Came in with misty weather rainey and cloudy schooner coming in company with Simmons son with at sun down took in sails, Lat 31.60 Long 49.25 West

Sunday May 18th Came in with light wind from the East and heavy squalls from the N West schooner under all sails beating to the windward at noon took ship standing to seaward Simmons on side,

Monday May 19th Came in with light wind from the South and clear weather scho^r on wind beating to seaward in company with Mary E Simmons, saw potatoes crew repairing sails pumps attended to, Lat 31.00 Long 48.48
