June 26th Sunday comes in with good breeze from the S West and clear weather, in morning raised Whales going N East, chase them and lower boats in after noon. Whales pursued the Boats, could not get to them, at sun down took boats up and shorten sails
Lat 37-30 Long 47, 27

Friday June 27th Comes in with nice breeze from the S West, in morning raised Whales going N East, at 7.30 A.M. lower two boats and chase at noon L.B. struck 50 Barrel Borel fire 5 bombs at him at 3.30 P.M. iron hook off went lost the Whale boats safe chasing at 4.30 P.M. L.B. struck another Whale kill him and we took in along side at 6 P.M. took boats up and get gears up ready to set in in next morning,

Saturday June 28th Comes in with moderate breeze from the S West at 6 A.M. we hoisted and commence to set in at 4 P.M. finish set in head chain part we lost the case, took gear down and took in mainmast and get supper at 7 P.M. Start fire
Lat no observation

Sunday June 29th Comes in with light wind from the S West. Schoor under short sails Boiling.
Lat 34, 30 Long 48, 27

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Monday June 30th Comes in with light wind from the S West and clear weather this day we finish Boiling and put some oil down Schoor under short sails working to the windward, pumps attended to,
Lat 34, 34 Long 48, 34 West

Tuesday July 1st Comes in with strong breeze from West and rough seas on Schoor under very short sails, we finish stow down the deck and clear up decks lost 3 rain in after noon, pumps attended to,
Lat 34, 48 Long 48, 50 W

Wednesday July 2nd Comes in with Gale wind from West and lot of rain squalls Schoor under very snug sails on port tack all day at sun down Ware round on starboard tack pumps attended every two hours
Lat 34, 52 Long 49, 10 W

Thursday July 3rd Comes in with more moderate wind but still rough from S West Schoor under short sails lots rain in morning, at 6, 40 P.M. raised 2 large Whales get before sun set not lower boats
Lat 34, 12 Long 48, 39 W

Friday July 4th Comes in with very nasty weather rough and rainy Schoor under short sails pumps attended to
Lat 33, 58 Long 48, 57
