

Wednesday November 5<sup>th</sup> Schooner Adelia Chase  
 sail from the port of New Bedford  
 on Whaling Voyage under command  
 of her former Master J. J. Lemna  
 for Voyage on North Atlantic ocean  
 with 17 mans complement of crew at 10 AM  
 we start from the Central Wharf under  
 tow of tug A. B. Hart, with S.West  
 wind and clear weather, at noon we  
 made tacks and we bit out at 5 PM  
 in pick with crew and set track

Screw driver

Thursday Nov 6<sup>th</sup> Came in with fresh breeze from the  
 South, and foggy weather schooner on  
 port tack heading S.W. by West at  
 four P.M. took ship to the Eastward  
 crew rigging up the boats, no observations  
 Lat 41-00 Long 70-36 West

Friday Nov 7<sup>th</sup> Came in with calm and foggy  
 weather schooner under short sails  
 at 10 AM spring up little breeze  
 from the N.W. schooner under short  
 sails steering of Coast we hooked  
 Daniel Reef, and P. Park, and sail  
 on P. Reef and Pears and we ran  
 new Gib sheet wipes all well on  
 board, rigging up the boats and some  
 other job, unknown checks " "  
 no observations Sunday, Lat 40-00 Long 70-00

Saturday Nov 8<sup>th</sup> Came in with strong breeze from  
 the South. Schooner under Reef fore  
 sail and fore staysail and main t'wa  
 on Starboard tack heading E.S. East  
 vessel taking land. pumps attended  
 to every hour in after noon lots of  
 rain at P.M. wind from S.West  
 Lat 38-40 Long 69-10-

Sunday Nov 9<sup>th</sup> Came in with heavy Gale from the  
 South and lots of rain and heavy seas  
 running. Schooner on Starboard tack under  
 reef trysails and reef fore stay sail  
 at 2 P.M. blow Hurricane force, at  
 7 P.M. more moderate we took reef  
 of main trysail, pumps attended  
 to every 4 hours. During the Gale  
 we have every stink well square all  
 round deck, at 10 P.M. hatching down  
 bows ends this day Lat 37-00 Long 68-00

Monday Nov 10<sup>th</sup> Came in with very strong breeze  
 from the S.West, schooner under trysails  
 and fore staysail on Starboard tack  
 steering S.E. by South at noon we  
 took West Boat in on deck, at  
 4.30 P.M. moderated some we set fore  
 sail, pumps attended to every 4 hours  
 Lat 4 dead making 36.40 Long 67.00

Tuesday Nov 11<sup>th</sup> Came in with strong breeze from  
 the N.W. West and rough seas on but  
 clear weather, schooner under trysail  
 and fore sail and Lib, on Port tack  
 steering S.E. by South, first day that  
 sun was sighted since we sail from  
 Home, Lat 36.31 Long 66-10 West-

Wednesday Nov 12<sup>th</sup> Came in with moderate breeze from  
 the East and clear weather wind working  
 to the Southward, in morning set main  
 sail. Crew employed on fixing up boats  
 and we put on new main mast  
 coat and fix Flying jennets  
 and men stop on main boom tacked  
 at sun down very moderate, pumps atten-  
 ded to, Lat 34.59 Long 61.00-
