Saturday Jan 31st. Came in with fresh breeze from the trade and blowy weather, Schooner on port tack under short sails working to the windward. Crew making sunset at sun down took in fore sail

Lat 17-33- Long 26-28 West

Sunday February 1st

Came in with moderate trades but cloudy weather, Schooner under short sails working to the windward at sun set took in sails, pumps attended to

Lat 18-29- Long 26-55

Monday Feb 2nd Came in with fresh trades in morning we set fore sail on Starboard a tack heading of East at 9 A.M. Raised a school of small Whales gave West we lower two boats, L.B. struck and Starboard Boat struck saw we caught four Whales and picked up a dead one that J.B. killed took the Whales along side and took boats up gal dinner and took gear up and commenced to cut in at 340 P.M. at sun down we set two Whales in our dock saw we mock off get supper and set watch to clear up the heads

Lat 18-30 Long 27-20 W.

Tuesday Feb 3rd Came in with fresh trades in morning we hove in and cut in after whale finished at 9 A.M. took gear down and made ready to start fire in afternoon Boiling at 18-45 Long 27-15

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Wednesday Feb 4th Came in with moderate trades Schooner on port tack Boiling at 9 A.M. bore round on Starboard tack we pumps fresh water getting ready to stem at down in afternoon we put some some air, Capt repairing Boat at 7 P.M. fire shed Boiling

Lat 18-14 Long 27-04

Thursday Feb 5th Came in with fresh trades and quite rough, Schooner on Starboard tack under short sails, we stow down oil and clear up the decks at P.M. picked up dead Whale at sun down took in fore sail set fore bysail, pumps attended to

Lat 18-49 Long 27-39 West

Friday Feb 6th Came in with strong trade and squally weather and rain in morning we cut the little Whale drest it was all blasted up, and bore round on Port tack, Joseph Manta in our company, Schooner under two bysails and Lib. we caught some fish. Crew washing the vessel in side in afternoon Hook Manta

Lat 18-47 Long 27-57 West

Saturday Feb 7th Came in with fresh trades and squally weather, Schooner under short sails on port tack, Joseph Manta in side Crew washing their old rages. pumps attended to
