Sunday May 3rd at anchor at St Vincent
no work to be done,

Monday May 4th came in with fresh trades, at 1 P.M.
we sail from St. Vincent for Western Ground
with 18 persons including Capt at 5 P.M.
shook reef of main sail and set main topsail
steering off N.W. by West - pumps attended to

Tuesday May 5th came in with moderate trade and
clear weather schooner under all sails on star-
board tack steering off N.W. by West, this day we
display the crew with slop chest, and we
overhol line tubs of both boats we put
one new short of line in them, pumps
attended to, Lat 18° 17' Long 27° 01' West -

Wednesday May 6th came in with fresh trades and
clear weather, schooner on starboard tack
with all sails set steering off N.W. by West, crew
making oakum and working on L. Boat sail
pumps attended to, Lat 17° 45' Long 30° 35' West -

Thursday May 7th came in with strong trades and clear
weather schooner on starboard tack, under
all sails, steering N.W. by West, crew making oakum
and working on L. Boat sail pumps atten-
ted to, Lat 18° 52' North, Long 33° 25' West -

Friday May 8th came in with moderate trades and
clear weather, schooner under all sails on
starboard tack steering N.W. by West crew making
some oakum and we finished making
new sail for L. Boat, pumps attended to
Lat 19° 50' Long 35° 05' West -

Saturday May 9th came in with moderate trade and
clear weather, schooner on starboard tack under
all sails, steering N.W. by North, crew making
oakum, we hauled N.W. L. Boat sail Lat 21° Long 37° 20'

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Sunday May 10th came in with moderate trades
and clear weather schooner under all sail
on starboard tack steering N.W. by North
at 9 A.M. Raised large lone whale
gain quit quick to the windward
at 11 o'clock lower boats and chase
L.B. struck him whale ached very bad
took along time to kill him so we
took him along side at 4 P.M., and
got dinner and took gear up and
made ready to cut in next day -

Lat 22° 30' Long 37° 20' West -
Monday May 11th came in with fine weather light
wind from the S. East and clear weather
in morning we hoisted an at 3 P.M.
we took body in, and made ready to work
at 5 P.M. we start fire left head
along side to be taking in tomorrow
sail ends this day, no observations

Tuesday May 12th came in with nice weather and clear
after breakfast we hooked on the junk took in
in and laid the case outside at noon fin-
shed, got dinner took gear down and start
fire again no sight taking pumps
attended to,

Wednesday May 13th came in with calm weather
schooner under short sails boiling
and we pumped out fresh water
and put some oil down,
Lat 23° 40' Long -

Thursday May 14th came in with calm weather and
clear, schooner under short sails boiling
and we put some oil down below -
no observations
