

1903

August 2nd Came in with very light wind from the S West and clear Weather. Schooner on Starboard tack all sails set Steaming S. East - Lat 38° 19' Long 28.50. we sighted Island of Pajos. at distance

Monday August 3rd Came in with nice breeze from the S West and clear Weather. at 9.30 A.M. we came to anchor at Pajos in 5 fathoms of water in afternoon we took on board 10 empty new casks to put oil in that we have on deck in Gunck casks, saw ends this day we dead not morrow the vessel we anchored side of Break water,

Thursday August 4th we landed 10 casks of oil on shore and took on board 6 casks of fresh Water and made ready for sea. there is no vessel to take oil so we have to go out again and wait wail and try to get more oil all thru this day light wind from the West and very late sun saw ends this day

Wednesday August 5th Came in with calm in morning at noon spring up little breeze. these say 7 of the crew refused to go to sea on the vessel and took brought American canoes on board after short talk with them they became willing to Proceed and at 3 P.M. we made sail and proceed to sea all night at sun down we took in main sail and Jib. and we lay under of Pajos all night.

Steward went on shore to see boat and get some more oil to take.

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Thursday August 6th Came in at first part with pleasant breeze from the N West and clear Weather schooner under all sails, evening around land we caught one porpoise. latter part with calm under St George, took sights to set Chronometer, found Chronometer 38th out to the Eastward, at sun down took in main sail Lat 38.50 Long 28.00 West

Friday August 7th Came in with good breeze from the East and clear Weather, schooner under all sails running off. Steaming West. later part moderate breeze, no observation, pumps attended to.

Saturday August 8th Came in with light Eastly wind, and clear Weather, schooner under all sails. Steaming to West crew doing iron work, and pumps attended to. Lat 36-38, Long 29.5-5 West

Sunday August 9th Came in with very light wind from the N East and clear Weather, schooner under all sails Steaming West. S. West. we saw lots of square head porpoises. pumps attended to saw ends this day. Lat 36.28 Long 31-37 West

Monday August 10th Came in with light wind from the N West and clear Weather schooner under all sails on Starboard tack heading W. S. West we caught some fish of large log. that we saw, Lat 36.28 Long 32.46

Thursday August 11th Came in with light wind from the N West and clear Weather, schooner on Starboard tack under all sails working to the Westward crew scraping worn Marking Paint. then pumps attended to. Lat 36-38 Long 33.46
