Sat. August 22<sup>nd</sup> came in with light wind from the East and clear Weather we still Bailing on Starboard tack all Baseley Sails and Standing Trousers. Lat. 35-23 Long 34-21.

Sunday August 23<sup>rd</sup> came in with light wind from the West fear wind we have run off. Stearing O by North all Sails set, Lat 35-57 Long 33-47

Monday August 24<sup>th</sup> came in with light wind from the West and clear Weather. Schooner under all Sails Stearing O by North. Crew cleaning the Vessel out side and in. Brockett Beef. Flour and small stores. Lat 37-03 Long 32-37

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Thursday August 25<sup>th</sup> came in with light wind from the S. West and clear Weather, all sails set on Starboard Tack Stearing off O by North. saw two merchant men going N. East. pumps attended to. Lat 37-25 Long 31-21,

Wednesday August 26<sup>th</sup> came in with light wind from the S. W. all sails set on Starboard Tack Stearing off O. S. E. in after noon we sighted Rio and Fayal. crew washing the vessel in side and we bent the chains. no observations taking

Thursday August 27<sup>th</sup> came in with light wind from the South and clear Weather at 10 A. M. we came to anchor at Fayal a coris and took has all day to move the vessel forward here Joseph Manta & Brigue Harry Smith

Friday August 28<sup>th</sup> at Fayal with light. Southly wind we got Brockett with tacks and came over to Brecknort at took on board some sweet and Irish Potatoes some fruit and fresh meat on deck went on shore

Saturday August 29<sup>th</sup> came in with light wind and clear Weather, at anchor at Fayal Brecknort Oil and Cook them ready for shipment

Sunday August 30<sup>th</sup> at Fayal with nice Weather, and clear, Starboard watch went on shore for the day. saw ends three days

Monday August 31<sup>st</sup> at Fayal a coris. with light wind from the South and clear Weather, we shipped one lighter of oil to Brigue Harry Smith and we took from shore 8 empty casks to put oil in that we brought on deck. saw ends three days
