Thursday Oct 1st at Fayal Acoris with light S West wind and clear Weather, arrived Pinnular howe slop and cutting fall was landed. this day 4 main runway, Paulo Javari and Vincim Encialus, Adolfo Rodrigues Silva Antomio Manuel dos Santos, we ship 3 seamen and one Boatsteerer James Craig of St. Helena, saw end of the day

Friday Oct 2nd came in with light wind clear Weather, we took on board slop cask that came on Steamer Pinnular, we opened the cask took out cutting fall and rove them ready for use and we have two new cutting Blocks made here we took on board lots of Rice and all supplies for the season, lots of Potatoes and onions and Pumpkins send Ham 72 casks 13,842 Gallons of oil

Saturday Oct 3rd at Fayal with strong Gale wind from the S West we built new fore and aft and wash her off, one watch went on liberty.

Sunday Oct 4th strong breeze from N East no work one watch on shore

Monday Oct 5th came in with Gale from S West blowing strong no setting Weather to sails

Tuesday Oct 6th at Fayal Weather more moderate but not set to sails wind N East

Wed. Oct 7th came in with light wind from the N East and clear Weather we sail from Fayal we was towed out side of Passack Water by tug tug and one sail

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Thursday Oct 8th came in with light wind from the S West Schooner under all sails on the board tack steering S East we went to Graciosa, at sunset we took in topsail kept only the crew with slop on ends this day.

Friday Oct 9th came in with heavy Gale from the S West and rough seas running Schooner under clove reef main try sail and fore stay sail hove to all night on port tack -

Saturday Oct 10th came in with fresh breeze from S West Weather more moderate wind haling round to the northward Schooner under two try sail and Gby. no observations

Sunday Oct 11th came in with heavy Gale from the N East and rough seas running Schooner on port tack under clove reef main try sail and fore stay sail wind blew hove force at night - in morning more moderate, vessel backing same during the blow, we set fore try sail and sheet feet of main try sail. this day
Lat 37, 06 Long 17, 26

Monday Oct 12th came in with strong breeze from the North and rough seas on Schooner under short sails on starboard tack steering S West lots rain. no observations

Tuesday Oct 13th with strong breeze from the N West and rough seas on and heavy rain. saw school of small whales cannot lower Boats. Lat 37, 00 Long 17, 00
