Sunday Nov 8th Came in with at first part we fresh breeze from the South and quite heavy seas on later part came we heavy rain squalls and strong breeze from the S West. we took on board 2 bags of sweet potatoes and all of Iron works that was made for the mill. Capt came on board at 5:30 P.M. right in rain squall and he ordered to hoist up anchor that was not safe to stay there during the night, so ends this day.

Monday Nov 9th Came in with strong breeze from the S West and rough seas on schooner under short sail biting between Tenerife and Grand Canary at 4:30 P.M. we saw sperm whale and large and gain north gulls we lower boats but cannot get to him to near night.

Tuesday Nov 10th Came in with strong breeze from the S West and very rough seas on schooner under short sails standing on Port tack we went by Tenerife at noon, steering S West wind held more to Eastward, no observations.

Wed Nov 11th Came in with light wind from the East and clear weather schooner under all sails steering S West crew making Oarum, and Brockout barrels of Beef and making new covers for main deck, pumps attended to.

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Thursday Nov 12th Came in with calm weather and clear Schooner under short sail in Peter Moore spring up like breeze we set main sail and main top sail steering S West crew making Oarum and new cover for deck, Capt cutting around stanchions forward and Waterways.

Friday Nov 13th Came in with calm weather in morning at noon spring like little breeze from the South we set main sail and flying Gib crew making Oarum and new covers for the after deck Capt sinking around coaling seams, pumps attended to so ends this day. Lat 25.10 Long 16.05 West

Saturday Nov 14th Came in with light wind from the N.E. and clear weather all sails set running off steering S West, we took in front anchor stoke to fix it later part calm we took in main sail. Lat 24.01 Long 17.40 West

Sunday Nov 15th Came in with light wind from N.E. and clear weather schooner under all sails steering S West Lat 22.20 Long 20.02 West

Monday Nov 16th Came in with fresh trades and clear weather schooner running off S West we finished working an anchor stoke and put it on, on his place, we spoke the Allen C. Swift with 80 Barrels Seneca lining Fajal, at sun down we short in sails.
