Wed. Nov 25th Came in with dead calm all day Schooner under main try sail and for stay sail we stow down oil and clean up decks and Wanker of, saw one merchant man going S. West pumps attended to
Lat 18 28 Long 26 20

Thurs. Nov 26th Came in with light wind from the trades and clear weather. Schooner under all sails fitting to the windward crew washing her of in ridge saw two merchant man going S. West, we brock out B Beef and Pumps attended to Lat 18 50 Long 25 20

Frid. Nov 27th Came in with strong trades and rough, Schooner under short sails working to the windward at sun down we took in fore sail and set fore try sail crew making Oacoom for ship, was pumps attended to
Lat 19 08 Long 26 29

Saturday Nov 28th Came in with strong trades and heavy weather, in morning we set fore sail, Schooner under short sails on port tack all day crew making Oacoom, we brock out Barrel of Flour and pumps attended to
Lat 18 10 Long 26 04 West

Sunday Nov 29th Came in with strong breeze from trades and rough seas on Schooner under short sails standing on wind in afternoon we was close to St Antoine at 4 P.M. we fore arrived on harbor tack saw two merchant man going S. West pumps attended to
Lat 17 20 Long 25 25 West

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Monday 30th last day of November Came in with strong breeze from the trades and rough seas on clear weather, Schooner on harbor tack under short sails at 330 P.M. we were arrived on port tack and set fore sail, we rose of new Lib sheets and crew making Oacoom, pumps attended to
Lat 18 15 Long 25 48 West

Dec 1st Came in with strong breeze from the trades at 3 P.M. we came to anchor at St Vincent & Verde for later and we bought Barrel of sugar, and sail at 7 P.M. for Bravo,

Dec 2nd we came to anchor at Bravo at 3 P.M. very strong trades blowing from this date till January 12th 1904 we lay at Bravo for harbor all this time been blowing trade Gale since weather not fit for Whaling lots of Ketch came in for harbor, we had some damage done by Schooner Free man when she arrived from San Bedford, it took Carpenter three days to repaired it, two Seaman running at this port, Julio Jones and Vincent Croft we kept 4 more names and sail January 12th for Whaling under strong trades at 2 P.M. we took in main sail yet and flying top blowing saw pumps attended to Don under day

Jan 13th 1904 Came in with strong trades Schooner under short sail standing on wind
Lat 16 17 Long 24 56 West
