Schooner Adelia Chase sail from
New Bedford for Whaling Voyage
under command of Capt. J. L. Linn
her former Master, with 12 per-
sons composed of crew. Vessel
in good order and staunch and
well fitted for the voyage.
droving 8 foot forward and so
after at 4 P. M. Thomas laid
back Northeast 15 miles off
for with I took my departure
thru N West light and clear
Weather all sails set Steaming
South. at 5 P. M. we decided
the crew at 7 P. M. we set
warstak Starboard warstak both
first warstak on deck.

light wind from the N West and
clear Weather schooner under
all sails Steaming S by East. crew
making men flying Gib Panant and
untied chain and stow them
down in fore hold Vessel on Star-
board tack all sails set.
Lat 39.05 Long 70.25 West

Monday Oct 17 Barnes in with light N West wind
and clear Weather Schooner on port
tack under all sails Steaming off
S by South. crew making fly-
ing Gib Panant. at 4 P. M. we
Gib Shepp on Starboard tack Steaming
South by East. Pumps attended to at
Lat 38.15 Long 70.20 West
