January 1 New Year of 1905.

Capt. new Year to all on Board - Came in with light wind from the trade and clear weather in morning we set main sail on Port tack, standing on wind at noon were ship on Port tack heading up to North at sun down shorting sails lay on same tack pump attended to

January 2 Came in with light trade and clear weather, all sail set in Starboard tack, working to the windward, crew making sunset at sun down shorting sails lay on same tack pump attended to

Jan. 3 Came in with light wind from the trade, and clear weather, schooner on Port tack under all sail set working to the South in afternoon we spoke to "Golden City" she ad 80 Barril cruise sail from New Bedford at sun set took in sails, lay on starboard tack pump attended to

Lat 18° 31' N Long 26° 32' W

Wednesday

Jan. 4 Came in with fresh trade and clear weather, schooner under short sail steering East the "Golden City" in side, steering off to West at noon is out of side, in afternoon saw schooner E. B. Council spoke to her she ad 150 Barril cruise sail from home, at 5 P.M. we start off to S. Vicente, pump attended to

Lat 18° 27' N Long 25° 38' W

Thursday

Jan. 5 Came in strong wind from the trade and clear weather, schooner under short sails on Port tack steering East to S. Vicente at 9 A.M. sighted land of St. Anthony, at sun down moderate wind we tack ship to Northward pump attended to

Three day no observation

Friday

Jan. 6 Came in with light wind from the trade and clear weather, at 10 A.M. off S. Vicente Cap went on shore to consult doctor at 3 P.M. Cap came on Board and we start off for cruise, pump attended to

Saturday

Jan. 7 Came in with strong trade and tick fog with rain in morning saw a merchant ship go to South, vessel under short sail on Starboard tack standing on wind pump attended to every two hours
