Monday June 19 First part of these day comes in with light breeze from the West and clear weather, Vessel under all sails set, on cruise, in afternoon we spoke to "Golden City", two more Whaler in sight, at sun set we shorting sails, lay on Starboard tack, pump attended to
Lat 37.00 Long 73.41

Tuesday June 20 First part of these day begins with light West Wind and clear weather, Vessel under all sail set, cruising in company with "Golden City" saw a Merchant Bark going East, and two more Whaling Schooner in sight, crew making sunset, at sun set we shorting sails, lay on Port tack, pump attended to
Lat 37.13 Long 73.44 W

Wednesday June 21 First part of these day begins with light West Wind and clear weather, Vessel under all sails set, cruising, at 8 o'clock A.M. we raised school of small Whales, we lower two Boats, we catch two Whales one each Boat, we took the Whales along side at 3 o'clock P.M. we hoist the Boats up, and put gear up, we commence cutting in at 3.30^{PM} at 6 o'clock, finish cutting in, we took gear down, and clear up the heads at 7 P.M. we let watch, three Whales in sight - pump attended to
Lat 37.25 Long 73.01

Thursday June 22 First part of these day begins with light West Wind, and heavy swell from the South, Vessel under two try sails and fore stay sails, Boiling on Port tack, saw a Steamer going East. This day we pump out some fresh water, have each all ready for oil, pump attended to every two hours -
Lat 37.40 Long 72.21 W

Friday June 23 First part of these day begins with light breeze and calm, and heavy swell on Vessel under two try sails and fore stay sails, at 7 o'clock A.M. we finish Boiling, we pump out some fresh water, and put some oil down, at noon we set fore sails and Flying jib, standing to the East on Starboard tack, three Whalers in sight, at sun set took in fore sail and Flying jib, set fore try sails, pump attended to
Lat 37.39 Long 73.24 W

Saturday June 24 First part of these day comes in with very strong wind from the East, and squalls, with rough sea on, Vessel under two try sails and fore stay sails, standing to the windward on Starboard tack. Vessel leak quite late, pump attended to
No observation sun's oblique

Sunday June 25 First part of these day comes in with light West wind and smooth sea with clear weather, Vessel under all sails set cruising - saw a three mast schooner bound South, saw grampus and porpoises, at sun set shorting sails, lay on Starboard tack, pump attended to
Lat 37.54 Long 73.54 W

Monday June 26 First part of these day comes in with light West wind, and clear weather. latter part with strong breeze, and rough sea on Vessel under short sails standing to the windward on on Port tack, saw three mast schooner going West, crew employs jib the Flying jib, pump attended to every two hours
Lat 37.25 Long 71.58
