Friday July 14 First part of this day began with very strong West Wind and clear weather. Vessel under two try sails and fib standing to the windward, at sun set were down lay on Port tack, pump attended to every two hours.

Saturday July 15 First part of this day began with very strong West Wind and rough sea on. Vessel under two try sails and fib standing to the windward. Saw a Porpoise and three mast shorn bound to Eastward. Saw a Brokaw, Reef, pump carefully attended to every two hours.
Lat 37.10 Long 71.58

Sunday July 16 First part of this day began with light N East Wind and clear weather. Schooner under all sails set steering S.W. Saw a lot of Porpoises, and merchant Brig going to South, at sun set shorting sails, pump attended to.
Lat 37.46 Long 72.07

Monday July 17 First part of this day began with fine West breeze and clear weather, vessel under all sails set working to the windward. Saw a Steamer bound to N West, this day we were now flying fib sheet, at sun set shorting sails pump attended to.
Lat 37.00 Long 72.34 W

Tuesday July 18 First part of this day came in with fresh West breeze, and foggy weather. Vessel under short sails standing to the windward. Saw Porpoises pump attended to.
Lat 36.54 Long 72.33

Wednesday July 19 First part of this day began with fresh West breeze and foggy. Vessel under fore sail main try sail and head sails, being to the windward, saw a Steamer bound N West, at sun set took in fore sails set fore try sail, pump attended to.
Lat 37.34 Long 72.41

Thursday July 20 First part of this day began with fresh West wind with rough sea on. Vessel under short sails, standing to the windward. at 1 P.M. more moderate wind we set main sails, on Starboard tack crew making sunset, pump attended to every two hours.
Lat 36.38 Long 73.00

Friday July 21 First part of this day came in with light breeze from the West, and foggy weather. Vessel under all sails set steering West, we spoke to "Elena Swift" at sun set shorting sails, pump attended to.
Lat 36.46 Long 73.08 W

Saturday July 22 First part of this day began with strong East wind with squally weather. Vessel under short sails standing to the windward. Saw a Grampus, "Swift", in sight. Saw a three mast schooner bound West, pump attended to no observation.

Sunday July 23 First part of this day began with fresh breeze from the N West and heavy swell from the East. Vessel under two try sails and fib standing to the windward, one Whaling schooner in sight. Saw a lot of merchant vessels bound to North, and we saw a school of Grampus, at sun down took in fib lay on Starboard tack, pump attended to.
