Tuesday August 8 First part of this day began with fresh West breeze and clear weather. Schooner under two try sails, and fire boiling and we pump out some fresh water, and put some oil down, at 3 P.M. we raised a school of small Whales, going to windward we lower two Boats, but can't get near the Whales went outside, but come on back at 5 P.M. we took in fire, lay on Port tack, pump attended every two hours. at 6 P.M. we finish Boiling, Lat 36.36 Long 73.54

Wednesday August 9 First part of this day began with fresh West breeze and clear weather, Vessel under two try sails and fire, on Port tack at 10 A.M. we raised two Bull Whales going to windward, quick we did not lower the Boats, at 11 Clock he out sight, this day we finish stow down oil, and night the in side, we put one new sail tow line on both tub, pump attended to every two hours. Lat 36.43 Long 74.11

Thursday August 10 First part of this day began with fire West breezes and clear, Vessel under all sails set cruising saw a merchant vessel bound to North, gave a lot of Parassas crew making oars, at sund set took in sails lay on Starboard tack, pump attended to, Lat 36.42 Long 74.10

Friday August 11 First part of this day began with good West breezes and heavy swell from the South, in morning we raised a school of small Whales, we lower two Boats, S.B. went on the Whale the Boatster, part the Lavin, did not get fast, then S.B. struck one, we take this Whale along side at 9 A.M. at 11 A.M. we finish cut in and took gear down, and clean up the head. Lat 36.42 Long 74.10

Saturday August 12 First part of this day began with strong West breeze and squally weather, Vessel under two try sails and fire cruising, at 9 clock A.M. we finish Boiling, we Brought Flour, at sun, set the took in fire, lay on Port tack, pump attended every two hours. Lat 36.48 Long 73.40

Sunday August 13 First part of this day began with strong West breeze and foggy weather, Vessel under two try sail and fire standing to the windward on Port tack, this day we finish stow the oil down, and stow off the hole, all ready for next fair, a sun set took in fire, pump attended every hours, Lat 36.42 Long 74.01

Monday August 14 First part of this day began with strong West breeze with rough sea on, Vessel under short sails, latter part with moderate wind and smooth sea we set all the sails standing to the South on Starboard tack, at 1 P.M. we compare the log with Steamer bound to South, North her log 74.18 our log 74.11 we cut 1 mile to East

Saw a Five masts Schooner bound to South, at sund set shorting sails, lay on Starboard tack, pump attended to, Lat 36.54 Long 74.18

Tuesday August 15 First part of this day began with very strong West wind and squall, latter part with strong wind and clear weather, Vessel under two try sails and fire try sail, standing to the windward on Port tack, we raised a school of small Whales we did not lower the Boats, in account of the weather, Vessel leak quite lot, Lat 36.36 Long 73.54
