Wednesday August 16 First part of these day began with heavy blowing West Wind with squally and rough sea running. Vessel under two try sails and fore stay sails standing to the Windward on Port tack. Vessel leaking quite lots, pump carefully attended every hour.

Lat 36.42 Long 13.30

Thursday August 17 First part of these day began with very strong NEast Wind with squally and rough sea on. Vessel under two try sails and fore stay sails standing to the Windward Starboard tack at 6. P.M. we were round on Port tack standing to the Eastward. Vessel leak quite lots, pump carefully attended.

Lat 36.52 Long 13.51

Friday August 18 First part of these day began with very strong NEast wind and heavy sea running. Vessel under two try sails and fore stay sails standing to the Windward on Starboard tack at 4. P.M. we were round on Port tack, Vessel leaking quite lots pump carefully attended.

Lat 37.00 Long 14.10

Saturday August 19 First part of these day began with strong NEast wind and clear weather, Vessel under short sails standing to the Windward, at 7. A.M. we raised a school of small Whales. We lower two Boats, first the Whales going quick to the seaward, at 8. Clock the Whales went out sight, Boat come on Board hoist up, and we standing to the Eastward on Port tack, at sun set we were round on Starboard tack.

Lat 36.48 Long 14.07

Saw 3 Bull Whales at 6.30 P.M. we were not far from the Boat in a cove of the Whales.

Give boat Barrel Pick.

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Sunday August 20 First part of these day began with moderate NEast breezes and clear weather, Vessel under all sails set letting up to the windward. at 10. A.M. we raised alone Whale, about four miles to the Windward, we chasing, at 11. A.M. he went out sight, we did not lower the Boats, at sun set took in sails lay on Starboard tack, we pass a ship deck floating on sea, pump attended to.

Lat 36.40 Long 13.35

Monday August 21 First part of these day began with light NEast breezes and clear weather, Vessel under all sails standing to the Eastward at noon were ship to Northward. Crew employed clean the Iron mast, at sun set we took in main sails & main try sails, pump attended to.

Lat 36.46 Long 13.32

Tuesday August 22 First part of these day began with very light breezes from the SEast and clear weather, schooner under all sails set on Starboard tack, steering West. Saw a steamer bound to North. Crew employed watch the vessel out side, pump attended to.

Lat 36.58 Long 13.30

Wednesday August 23 First part of these day began with very light SEast breezes, and clear weather, Vessel under all sails set, running off ENEast, saw three mast schooner going to South, crew employed sweep the masts, saw a Grampus, pump attended to.

Lat 37.25 Long 13.50
