

Thursday August 24 First part of this day began with dead calm and dead weather, at 8 clock A.M. We Raised a school of small Whales, we lower two boats chasing all fore noon, at 2 P.M. S. Boat struck Whull, at 3 P.M. we take these Whales along side, at 6 P.M. we finished out in and took gear down clear up the head, and set Watch, pumps attended to.

Friday August 25 First part of this day began with fresh West breeze, with squally all day, vessel under short sails Boiling, running off to Eastward, saw three small Schooner bound to West, at 7 clock P.M. We finished Boiling pumps attended to

Saturday August 26 First part of this day began with fresh West breeze, and squally, latter part, wind shift to the West, blowing hard, with the rough sea, we set the boat on up crane, vessel under two try sails and fore stay sail, standing to the Windward, then day we finished stow down the oil and stow off the poles, pumps carefully attended to.

Sunday August 27 First part of this day, strong West wind and clear weather, with very rough sea, Schooner under two try sails and fore stay sails, standing to the Windward, We rub gear off sheet, pumps attended to every hour Ship leak quite tight

Monday August 28 First part of this day began with strong West wind, and rough sea on latter part, moderate wind we set fore sail, and flying jib, beating to the Windward, saw a Steamer going to West, vessel leak quite tight, pumps carefully attended to.

Tuesday August 29 First part of this day began with strong West wind and squally, at noon wind, house up to the West with rough sea on, Schooner under two try sails and fore stay sail, running off NW for home, at 6 P.M. moderate wind we set fore sails, vessel leak quite tight, pumps carefully attended to.

Wednesday August 30 First part of this day began with strong West wind with squally all day, vessel under short sails steering N by E, saw a Barkentine bound to the Eastward, crew wash the vessel in side, pumps attended to no observation from the Schooner

Thursday August 31 First part of this day began with fresh breeze from the West, light foggy weather vessel under main sail fore sail and head sails — steering N by West, at 7 A.M. we saw the Block Island, about 6 off, we kept beating all fore noon, at 1 clock P.M. we took the Pilot off "Key & Choking" Light Ship, at 7 P.M. we anchor on Coreutins Ground, crew took eating stage in, and took the things out of the Boats — at 11 P.M. we get to Central Wharf, saw head of this voyage —
