

Schooner, "Adelia Chase" Log Book
Commenced May 30th 1906.

Wednesday May 30, schooner "Adelia Chase" sail from
New Bedford, for Whaling voyage under com-
mand of Joseph H. Hanna her former master with
17 persons composed of crew, vessel, in good
order, and staunch and well fitted for the voyage
drawing 8 foot load and 10 asets, at 2:35 P.M.
no land seen bearing Northeast 12 miles off for which
I took my departure, wind South West ship heading
South under all sails set, at 5 P.M. we divided
the crew, at 7 P.M. we set watch, Starboard, took
first watch on deck.

Thursday May 31. First part of this day came in
with strong South breeze and cloudy weather
vessel under main try sail, fore sail and jib
standing to the windward on starboard tack
crew employed repaired de line, we put two
coils of new line, at 2 clock P.M. we were
pounded on Port tack vessel leak quite bad
pump attended to sun obscure no observation
save a steamer bound to North East.

Friday June 1. First part of this day came in with
moderate wind from the South West and dark
weather, in morning we set main sail and jib
jib on Port tack, at 3 P.M. began to hoist up stay
we took in main sail, set main try sail
vessel leak some, pump carefully attended
no observation

Saturday June 2 First part of this day came in with
light breeze from the South West and rain.
all day, vessel under two try sails and jib
standing to the South on starboard tack
saw a three mast schooner bound to South
at 6 P.M. weather be foggy pump attended to
Lat 39° 40' Long 70° 53' W
