Sunday June 3 First part of this day came in with fine breezes from the North West and clear weather, in morning we set main sail and flying fit on starboard tack, steering south west at 6 o'clock in evening we raised a school of small whales, to the windward about four miles, we kept belting up, but we could not get near, at sun set we took in main sail and flying fit, lay on starboard tack pump attended to

Lat 38° 53' N Long 71° 20' W

Monday June 4 First part of this day came in with very light Easterly Wind, vessel under all sails set cruising, at 4 P.M. we spoke to "William Grozier" she had 330 barrel hump sail from this Bedford, at sun set we shorting sail lay on Port tack, pump attended to

Lat 38° 30' N Long 71° 25' W

Tuesday June 5 First part of this day came in with fresh West breeze and clear weather, vessel under all sails set, standing to the South on starboard tack, in morning we saw a Bark "Chahu W. Mogau" at 2 P.M. went on board of her, and returned at 2 o'clock. P.M., at 2.30 P.M. we raised a school of small whales, we lower two boats, we catch two one each boat at 5 P.M. we take these whales along side and we put gears up, all ready to eat in next morning, "William Grozier" in sight pump attended to

Lat 38° 22' N Long 71° 24' W

Wednesday June 6 First part of this day, strong South West breeze and clear weather, in morning we commence to put in whale, at 11 o'clock P.M. we finish, and we took gear down and clear up the head at 8 P.M. we start fire were round on Port tack, Lat 38° 36' N Long 71° 14' W

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Thursday June 7 First part of this day, fresh breeze from the North East, and foggy weather, vessel under two try sails and jib, Boiling, on Port tack pump attended to

Lat 38° 36' N Long 71° 35' W

Friday June 8 First part of this day began with very light breeze from the South East, and clear weather at 5 A.M. we finish boiling, and we stowed down the oil and wash the vessel in sight, vessel under two try sails lay on Port tack, pump attended to

Lat 38° 35' N Long 71° 40' W

Saturday June 9 First part of this day began with light breeze from the South West and foggy weather, vessel under all sails set, cruising, Bark "Mogau" in sight at 11 A.M. she put sight some school of grampse at sun set we shorting sails and lay on Port tack pump attended to

Lat 38° 18' N Long 71° 01' W

Sunday June 10 First part of this day, light breeze from the South West and foggy, in morning we set all sails, standing to the South on starboard tack, latter part fresh breeze with rough sea saw merchant three mail schooner going to North at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to

Lat 38° 30' N Long 71° 08' W

Monday June 11 First part of this day, light breeze from the Easterly and foggy, with rain, latter part with fresh breeze, and rough sea vessel under main try sail fore sail and jib, steering West at 4 P.M. we raised a school of small whales going to the windward quick, we did not lower the boats, at 5.30 the whales was out of sight, at 7 P.M. we took in fore sail set fore try sail, lay on starboard tack pump attended to, no observation
