June 12

First part of these day strong breezes from the Northeast and clear weather latter part light breezes and heavy swell from the East. Vessel under try sail, foresail and jib, steering South on Port tack. Saw six small shovener bound to North, at sun set took up fore sail set fore try sail. Crew making Oboe, pump attended to.

Wednesday June 13 First part of these day light breezes from the Southeast and clear weather, we set all sail in morning, standing to the South, on Port tack latter part strong breezes, and rough seas, with squalls we took up main sail and fore sail, set try sails "Grosier" in sight, saw a school of Grampus pump attended to, foggy weather sun obscure Lat 38.40 Long 71.44 W by Dead Reckoning.

Thursday June 14 First part of these day very light breezes and heavy swell from the North East, vessel under fore sail main try sail and jib, latter part calm, we took in fore sail set fore try sail "Williams Grosier" in sight, pump attended to Lat 38.45 Long 72.03 W.

Friday June 15 First part of these day very light breezes from the South West and foggy weather vessel under all sails set evening, saw a lot of porpoise, crew making sunset, "Grosier" in sight, at sun set we shorting sails lay on Starboard tack, pump attended to.

Lat 38.17 Long 72.07 W.

Saturday June 16 First part of these day, began with very light breezes from the South East and clear weather vessel under all sails set, cruising. at 6:30 in morning we raised a school of small Whales we lower two Boats, at 11:00 A.M. 2 Boats steaked and we took three Whales along side at 1 P.M. we put gear up and came out in at 4. We

We finish out in whale, and get gear down and, clear up the head, at 7 P.M. shortening and set watch at 9 P.M. we start fire, Whaling Schooner "Grosier" in sight, and more mercantile vessel bound to the South, pump attended to Lat 38.23 Long 72.06 W.

Sunday June 17 First part of these day began with light South West breezes, and clear weather in morning we set main sails and flying jib, on Starboard tack, steering South, still we boiling, at 7: A.M. we raised a school of small Whales going to the Windward, quick we lower two Boats, but we can not get near, to the Whales, at 10: A.M. the Whales went out sight, the come on board we hoist up and were ship on Port tack - at 4 P.M. we raised a school of small Whales to the Windward, we did not lower the Boats now to far, at 6: P.M. whale was out sight - we took in main sails and flying jib. lay on Port tack, at 7: P.M. we finish boiling pump attended to.

Monday June 18 First of these day, light breezes from the South East and foggy with heavy rain, vessel under two try sails and jib, standing to the Windward on Port tack, at 10 clock we sighted the Whaling schooner "Bertha Dickson" she lower her Boat the Capt. come on Board, for few minutes she 4 days out from New Bedford, in after noon the weather clear up, and more moderate rain we stow down the del, and stow of the hole at 6: P.M. were round on Starboard tack, pump attended to, no observation sun obscure.
