Thursday June 28 First part of this day dead calm, latter part very light breeze from the Northwest and foggy weather. We set all sails, steering S. by W. at sun set shorting sails pump attended to. Lat 38° 20' Long 121° 02' W.

Friday June 29 First part of this day began with strong breeze from the South West, with squall and rough sea. Vessel under two try sails and jib standing to the windward on Starboard tack, pump carefully attended - no observation, sun obscure.

Saturday June 30 First part of this day strong breeze from the Southwest and foggy. Vessel under try sails and jib standing to the windward on Starboard tack, at 6 o'clock P.M. we were powned on Port tack, pump attended to. Lat 37° 48' Long 121° 20' W.

Sunday July 1 First part of this day began with fresh westerly wind and rough sea, on latter part moderate wind we set main sail fore sail and flying jib. The wind shifted to the Northeast, we steer S.W. by W. we sighted a whaling schooner head of us, at sun set shorting sails pump attended to. Lat 37° 38' Long 121° 44'

Monday July 2 First part of this day strong breeze from the South West and rough sea. Vessel under two try sails and jib standing to the windward on Starboard tack, two Whalers in sight at sun set were powned on Starboard tack pump attended to. Lat 37° 10' Long 121° 13'

Tuesday July 3 First part of this day began with very strong breeze from the Southwest and rough sea on vessel under two try sails and jib standing to the windward on Starboard tack, at 6 P.M. we were powned on Port tack, pump carefully attended, two Whalers in sight.

Lat 37° 04' Long 121° 15'
Wednesday July 4 First part of this day began with strong breeze from the Southwest and clear weather. Vessel under two try sails and fore sail standing to the windward on Starboard tack, at 4 P.M. we were powned on Port tack "John R. Manta" in sight. Great ship much water on deck, pump attended to. Lat 37° 05' Long 121° 08'

Thursday July 5 First part of this day, very light breeze from the Northeast and rain in morning. Vessel under two try sails and jib, latter part with light wind and clear weather, we set all the sails, on Port tack running of steering South, in company with "John Manta" at 4 P.M. we raised a school of small Whales, we lowered two boats, and "Manta" lower two, at 5:30 P.M. we took one small whale, we take the whale along side at 9 P.M. and we shorting sails, pump attended to no observation sun obscure.

Friday July 6 First part of this day began with dead calm, at 5 o'clock in morning, we put gear up and commence to cut in whale. We raised a school of small Whales we lowered one boat, and "John Manta" lower two, the whales going quick to the windward the boats came near, at 8:30 P.M. we finish cut in whale, and we look gear down, and we set fore sail with jib, breeze from the Southwest and rain, we steer South.
