at 2:30 P.M. we raised another school of small Whales, we lower two Boats, both Boats struck and D.B. lost his Whales, we saw one, we took three Whales along side at 3: P.M. and we put gear up and commence cut in at 5: P.M. we finish cut in and take gear down, and shorting sail, we did not start the fire in account of the rain - pump attended to no observation, sun obscure

Saturday July 7 First part of this day began with light breezes from the Southwest with rain, at 7: A.M. we start the fire, vessel under two top sails and fly, sailing "John Manta" in sight pump attended to,
Lat 37° 04 Long 73° 14 W.

Sunday July 8 First part very light wind from the Northwest, and clear weather, at 6: in morning we finish boiling and we set fore sail on Starboard tack, "Elena Sweet" in sight at 8: clock, A.M. the Sweet raised a school of small Whales, she lower three Boats, we lower two she catch two Whales, our Boat catch one, we take three Whales along side at 5:30: P.M. and we put gear up, at 6:30 we commence cut in at 8:30 we finish cut in and clear up the head, and set watch, pump, attended to
Lat 36° 50 Long 72° 30 W.

Monday July 9 First part of this day began with very light breezes from the Northeast and clear weather, at 8: A.M. we start fire, and we set main sail and flying fly on Starboard tack, at 8:30 A.M. we raised a school of small Whales, we lower two Boats and both get fast on Whales, Boat get rool over the line get foul on log head, he lost his Whales and Boat caught two small Whales, and we peak up the Boat, and we take three Whales along side at 11: A.M. and we put gear up at 1: we

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commence cut in Whales, and began to rain all afternoon, at 4: P.M. we finish cut in Whales - and we clear up the head, at 6: P.M. we took in main sail, and flying fly pump, attended to.
Lat 37° 15 Long 72° 37 W.

Tuesday July 10 First part of this day dead calm latter part very light breezes from the Northwest and clear weather, vessel under main sail and head sail on Starboard tack, sailing this day we pump out some fresh water, and we stow some oil down "Sweet" in sight and more merchant vessel bound to North, at sun down we took in main sail and set main by sail, pump, attended to
Lat 37° 06 Long 72° 17 W.

Wednesday July 11 First part of this day with very light breezes from the South West, and clear weather, in morning we set mainsail and flying fly, standing to the Windward on Port tack, "Elena Sweet" in sight at 3: P.M. we finish boiling, and we set fore sail and we stow some oil down and put some fresh water on deck, at sun set we took in main sail, and flying fly, pump, attended to
Lat 37° 46 Long 71° 20 W.

Thursday July 12 First part of this day began with dead calm, and latter part with very light breezes from the Northeast, and foggy weather, vessel under all sails set, steering S.W. this day we finish stow down and stow off the hold, and wash the vessel in side, at sun set we shorting sail pump, attended to
Lat 37° 38 Long 72° 09 W.

Friday July 13 First part of this day very strong breezes from Northeast, and foggy weather, with rough sea vessel under two top sails and fore stay sail standing to the Windward on Port tack, saw a two masted schooner, bound to the north, vessel ship much water on deck pump attended to
Lat 37° 25 Long 72° 08 W.
