Saturday July 14 First part of this day began with fresh breezes from the North and foggy, with heavy swell from the Northeast, vessel under main topsail, fore sail and head sails, steering West on Starboard tack, saw a merchant four mast schooner bound to North, at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to
Lat 37.00 Long 73.08 W

Sunday July 15 First part of this day dead calm, with rain, latter part very strong breezes from the Southwest with squally, vessel under two topsails and fore topsail, standing to the windward on Starboard tack, at 4: P.M. we were round on Port tack, Whaling schooner in sight, pump attended to
Lat 37.09 Long 72.54

Monday July 16 First part of this day began with moderate wind from the Southwest, and foggy, in morning we set main sail on Starboard tack standing to the Southeast, two Whalers in sight latter part with strong breezes, and rough sea we took in main sail and fore sail and flying jib, set fore and main topsails we compare the time with Steamer, we was 8 miles to the Eastward, pump attended to
Lat 37.09 Long 73.18

Tuesday July 17 First part of this day began with very strong wind from the Southwest, and squally, vessel under two topsails and fore topsail standing to the windward, saw a lot of merchant vessels bound to the North, vessel shipping much water on deck, pump carefully attended to
Lat 37.15 Long 72.48

Wednesday July 18 First part of this day began with strong West breezes, and clear weather, vessel under two topsails and fore topsail standing to the windward on Starboard tack, latter part more moderate wind, we set fore sails and head sails, were ship on Port tack, saw lots of porpoise, at sun set we took in flying jib pump attended to
Lat 37.28 Long 73.38

Thursday July 19 First part of this day began with very light breezes from the Southwest and clear weather, vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack, standing to the Southeast, at 3 clock P.M. we saw a school of small whales, going to Southwest, we lower two boats, but the Whales going to quick, the boats could not get near, at 5: P.M. the Whales all must out sight, the boats come on board at 6: P.M. we hoist up, and were ship on Port tack at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to
Lat 37.28 Long 72.54

Friday July 20 First part of this day began with very light Southwesterly wind, and clear weather, in morning we made all sails on Starboard tack, at noon were ship to the Westward, "Elena Swift" in sight, at 4: P.M. we came with "Swift" east, on board, and return at 6: P.M. saw lots of grampas, at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to
Lat 37.28 Long 73.15

Saturday July 21 First part of this day began with light breezes from the Southwest, and clear weather, in morning we made all sails, and standing to the South on Starboard tack, in company with "Swift" and "Manta" at 4: P.M. we speak to Manta she had 600 Barrel, at sun set we shorting sails, pump attended to
Lat 36.53 Long 73.07
