Sunday July 22 First part of these day began with moderate breezes from the South West and clear weather, in morning we set main sails on Starboard tack, standing to the South in company with Swift, at 3: P.M. breeze up strong we took in main sails and fore sails, and set fore and main try sails, Vessel shipping much water on deck, pump attended to
Lat 31° 10' Long 73° 01'

Monday July 23 First part of these day began with very strong breezes from the South West, and clear weather, Vessel under two try sails and jib, on Port tack, latter part, strong wind with squally and heavy sea we took in jib, saw a lot of muskrat Vessel bound to North, Vessel heave some, pump attended to
Lat 31° 16' Long 73° 20' W.

Tuesday July 24 First part of these day began with strong West breezes, with rain all day Vessel under two try sails, and jib, standing to the Windward on Starboard tack, at noon were rounded on Port tack, "Swift" in sight at 9: A.M. Saw a Steamer bound to the South, Vessel shipping much water on deck, pump attended to
No observation, Sun obscured

Wednesday July 25 First part of these day began with moderate breezes from the North East with rain Vessel under two try sails and jib, running off to the Southwest, at 6: clock in morning we raised a School of small Whales, we lower two Boats, both Boats struck, and a Boat, lose his Whale, harpoon broke, S. Boat catch one young Bull, we take these Whales along side, at 12: clock we put gear up and commenced to cut in at 4: P.M. we finish cut in we took gear down and clear up the head and set watch, Lat 31° 07' Long 73° 40'

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Thursday July 26 First part of these day began with strong breezes from the North East and rough sea, on Vessel under two try sails and jib, boiling, on Port tack, at 6: P.M. moderate wind, we were rounded on Starboard tack, "Swift" in sight and more muskrat vessels bound to the Southwest, pump attended to
Lat 36° 42' Long 73° 56' W.

Friday July 27 First part of these day began with light breezes from the North East and clear weather in morning we finish boiling, and we set fore sails on Starboard tack, at 6: A.M. we saw the "Swift" with boats down chasing Whales, and we lower two Boats, Swift catch three small Whales, and we catch one young Bull, we take these Whales along side, at 11: A.M. and we put gear up and commence cut in, at 4: P.M. we finish cut in whale, and took gear down and clear up the head, and pump out some fresh water, and we stow some oil down at Sun set we shorting sails, pump attended to
Lat 36° 42' Long 73° 49'

Saturday July 28 First part of these day began with dead calm, latter part very light breezes from the Southwest and clear weather we set flying jib and fore try sails, on Starboard tack, "Boiling" "Swift" in sight saw a lot of porpoises, at sun down we took in flying jib, pump attended to
Lat 36° 42' Long 73° 46'

Sunday July 29 First part of these day began with light breezes from the Southwest, at 5: clock in morning we finish boiling, Vessel under main try sails, fore sails, and head sails, on Starboard tack, latter part with strong wind we took in fore sails and set fore try sails, at 4:30 P.M. we raised a three small Whales going quick to the Windward, we did not lower the Boats, these day we finish stow gear, and wash the deck, Lat 31° 07' Long 73° 40'
